My dear Brothers and Sisters,



#### THE SOLEMNITY OF MARY, MOTHER OF GOD ON NEW YEAR'S DAY.

May I take this opportunity to wish you all a Happy and Peaceful New Year 2020. I pray that the Lord Jesus and His Mother Mary, may enrich your lives during the New Year with an abundance of God's blessings. It is very appropriate to begin the new year with the Solemnity of the Blessed Virgin Mary. This celebration reminds us that the Blessed Virgin Mary, the Mother of God, is also our Heavenly Mother.

Pope Paul VI instituted this Solemnity to commemorate the role of Mary in the mystery of our salvation. Through Mary we were found worthy to receive the Savior of our life." The solemnity shows the relationship of Jesus to Mary.

This feast helps us to understand the position of Mary in the church. She is the mother of Jesus, the Mother of God, the Mother of the church and lastly our Spiritual mother. Jesus became one of us through Mary and it was through Jesus Christ, that we came Children of God.

Mary is the Arch Saint. No saint is above Mary. The Church puts the feast on the first day of the New Year to emphasize the importance of Mary's role in the life of Christ and of the Church. We commemorate the various saints on different days of the year, but Mary is the most prominent. She has a special role and mission given to her by God. As Mother of our Redeemer and of the redeemed, she reigns as Queen at the side of Christ the King.

She intercedes for all of our needs here on earth. In celebrating her special feast day, we acknowledge this great gift for the Church and world; we call on her to be actively involved in our daily life; we imitate her virtuous life as a great inspiration; and we cooperate with all the graces we get through her.

We do not worship Mary as we worship or adore God. We honor her, respect her, love her and seek her intercession, praying, "Holy Mary, Mother of God, pray for us sinners." We do not, ever, equate Mary with God nor replace God with her. Mary is honored because she was chosen to be the Mother of Jesus.

We learn from the Holy Scriptures and Sacred Tradition that God filled the mother of His only Son with all heavenly graces, freed her at the moment of her conception from original sin, allowed her to play an active role in the redemptive work of Jesus, and finally took her to Heaven, body and soul, after her death

As He was dying on the cross, Jesus gave us the precious gift of His own mother to be our Heavenly Mother. When Jesus saw his mother there, and the disciple he loved standing nearby, he said to her: "Woman, here is your son, and to the disciple "Here is your Mother"

Mary is a central figure in the Catholic Faith and her life illustrates how our Almighty Father works in our lives. Mary came from a simple background and yet she was called by God to fulfill a very extraordinary role; that of becoming the mother of Jesus Christ.

This role was no easy feat. During Mary's time, women did not have equal standing as men in society. When Simeon came to see the baby, he blessed them and said to Mary, his mother: "This child is destined to cause the falling and rising of Many in Israel and to be sign that will be spoken against, so that the hearts of Many will be revealed. A sword will pierce your heart".

Second, when Jesus was born, King Herod ordered infants everywhere to be slaughtered so Mary had to flee to Egypt to escape the massacre and save the child. Despite the hardships she had to go through, Mary became an instrument of faith and stayed committed in her role of bringing to life God's promised son.

Humility is one of the most fundamental values we should have as Christians. We can only receive Christ when we are humble and meek. Mary teaches us that pride and selfishness is something that we must avoid. She had an extraordinary role as the Mother of God and yet she remained humble in her ways and continued to serve the Lord with devotion.

Let us strive to be pure and holy like our Heavenly Mother. All mothers want their children to acquire their good qualities. Our Heavenly Mother is no exception. With Joseph, she succeeded in training the Child Jesus, so that He grew in holiness and in "favor before God and man." Hence, our best way of celebrating this feast and honoring our Heavenly Mother would be to promise her that we will practice her virtues of Faith, obedience, purity and humble service. In this way, we will be trying to become the saintly sons and daughters of our Heavenly Mother, the Holy Mother of God.

We need our Heavenly Mother's prayers to have a better physical life and spiritual life in the New Year: Let us ask for our Heavenly Mother's help so that we may glorify God with a healthier physical and spiritual life and a better appreciation of life. We need a Super-Mother like Jesus' mother Mary to stop millions of people who kill babies, and to encourage nations to enact and implement laws to stop mass-murders by terrorist and fanatic groups.

We need to honor Mary as the mother of Jesus: "We honor Mary by actively participating in Mass and in all the Marian feasts of the Church throughout the year. In Mass and at other times, we give Mary the highest honor, because of the gifts of grace God granted her and because of the way she responded to these gifts. We also honor her in all the forms of Marian prayer we say: The Rosary, the Angelus, the Queen of Heaven ( *Regina Caeli*), the Hail Holy Queen, the *Memorare*, and so on. These are prayers we should pray so often and have them memorized.
