Lent: Ash Wednesday through Holy Saturday.

The season of Lent begins with Ash Wednesday and lasts until the final Saturday before Easter, Holy Saturday. Lent is a penitential season. It recalls the 40 days Jesus spent in the desert, and the 40 years the Israelites wandered in the desert. Lent focuses on the events leading up to Christ's passion, and finally on the Passion itself. Lent is 40 days long. This does not include Sundays, as Sunday is always a day for rejoicing in the Resurrection. Altogether, it covers 46 calendar days, the 40 days plus the six Sundays. The liturgical colors of Lent are violet or purple. Rose may also be used, where it is the custom, on *Laetare* Sunday which is the Fourth Sunday during Lent.

On Passion Sunday which is also the Palm Sunday and on Good Friday which has no Mass but a service remembering Christ's passion, the color is red. White is worn on Holy Thursday and Holy Saturday.

Easter: Easter Vigil though Pentecost:

The Easter season begins with the Easter Vigil, which is celebrated after night falls on the evening before Easter Sunday. The season of Easter is a joyous, celebratory season. It begins with the celebration of Christ's resurrection and ends with the celebration of the descent of the Holy Spirit upon the Apostles and other followers of Jesus. Christ's ascension into Heaven is celebrated just prior to Pentecost. The Easter season lasts 50 days, from Easter Sunday through Pentecost. The liturgical colors of Easter are white, for most days, and red for Pentecost. After Pentecost, the ordinary time resumes.

The prayer Queen Of Heaven is recited throughout the Easter Season in the place of the Angelus. The Mass, during Easter, is concluded with words Alleluia, Alleluia said by the priest and repeated by the congregation. St. Joseph's Financial February 29, 2020

Special thanks go to the Parishioners of St. Joseph Woodlawn for the wonderful donation of School supplies to the Ugandan school children. The parish collected a total amount of \$ 1300. We bought school supplies ranging from hard cover exercise books, pens to pencils and mathematical Geometry sets. We were able to give books to 250 pupils of different grades.

In addition a rare donation of 5 bicycles was bought for the village students to transport them to school. Students walk to school everyday and the distance takes them 1 hour. They reach school already exhausted. They start their journey to school at dawn when still dark. They are blessed because the distance that is always covered within one hour on foot now takes them only 15 minutes.

This was a life changing gift. This is a great gift especially to girls because going to school on foot often brings big challenges to them. I believe many of them will be able to complete school successfully. Each bicycle cost \$ 100. The parents and children appreciated your great generosity. May God bless you all.

The Solemnity of the Annunciation March 25th

The Solemnity of the Annunciation celebrates the coming of the Angel Gabriel to the Virgin Mary to announce to her the special mission God had chosen for her in being the mother of His only son.

We are continually reminded of the importance of this feast to our salvation in various devotional prayers. Two examples that highlight the importance of this feast are the joyous mysteries of the Rosary and the Angelus.

The feast of the Annunciation began to be celebrated on this day during the fourth and fifth centuries, soon after the date for celebrating Christmas was universalized throughout the Church. This feast celebrates the Incarnation of the Second Person of the Trinity and the salvation of all mankind. This point of our salvation was deeply discussed by many of the Church fathers, to explain it to the faithful and to show the deep love God has for us. Some of the Church fathers who wrote on this were St. Athanasius, St. Gregory of Nyssa and St. Augustine.

Saint Joseph's Story

The Bible pays Joseph the highest compliment: he was a "just" man. The quality meant a lot more than faithfulness in paying debts.

When the Bible speaks of God "justifying" someone, it means that God, the all-holy or "righteous" one, so transforms a person that the individual shares somehow in God's own holiness, and hence it is really "right" for God to love him or her. In other words, God is not playing games, acting as if we were lovable when we are not.

By saying Joseph was "just," the Bible means that he was one who was completely open to all that God wanted to do for him. He became holy by opening himself totally to God.

The rest we can easily surmise. Think of the kind of love with which he wooed and won Mary, and the depth of the love they shared during their marriage.

It is no contradiction of Joseph's manly holiness that he decided to divorce Mary when she was found to be with child. The important words of the Bible are that he planned to do this "quietly" because he was "a righteous man, yet unwilling to expose her to shame" (Matthew 1:19).

The just man was simply, joyfully, wholeheartedly obedient to God—in marrying Mary, in naming Jesus, in shepherding the precious pair to Egypt, in bringing them to Nazareth, in the undetermined number of years of quiet faith and courage.
