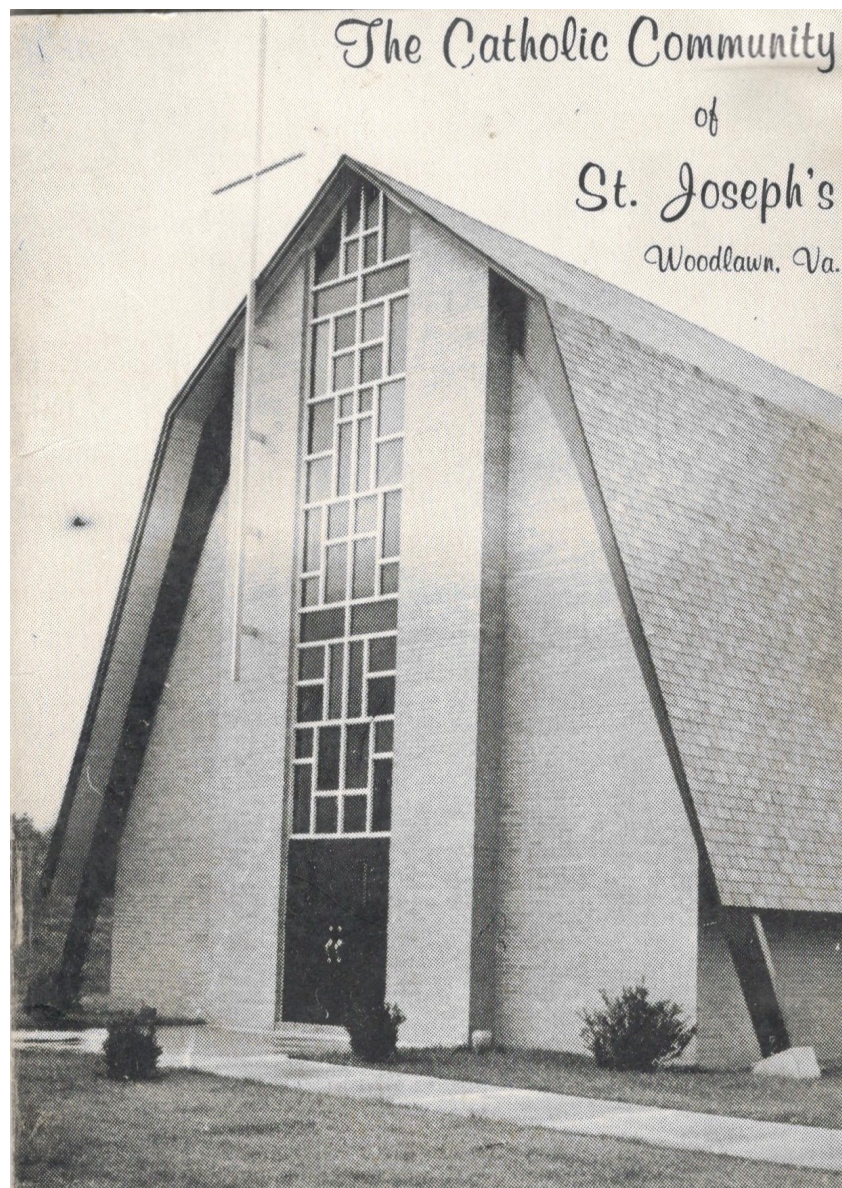

We celebrate Father's Day on Sunday, June 20, 2021. We think of the strength of a father, his guiding hand, his wisdom, his help.

God the Father gave up his only Son, Jesus Christ, so that we might be saved through him.

He provides an example of the very vocation of fatherhood.

Fathers are to sacrifice their lives for their families. They do this by:

- Being the spiritual leader and guardian of their families.
- Praying for and with their families.
- Being a courageous witness to the Gospel.
- Providing care and support for their families.
- Serving as an example of goodness and truth.
- Leading with courage and accountability.
- Laying down one's life for another.

On this day in a special way, let us be grateful for:

- Our fathers, by birth or adoption, who love us and support us through life.
- Our Church leaders, who take on the paternal role of guiding us through life.
- And God our Father, who will always teach justly and grant us boundless mercy.

Reading: LK 15: 11-32: Then he said, *"A man had two sons, and the younger son said to his father, 'Father, give me the share of your estate that should come to me.' So the father divided the property between them. After a few days, the younger son collected all his belongings and set off to a distant country where he squandered his inheritance on a life of dissipation. When he had freely spent everything, a severe famine struck that country, and he found himself in dire need. So he hired himself out to one of the local citizens who sent him to his farm to tend the swine. And he longed to eat his fill of the pods on which the swine fed, but nobody gave him any. Coming to his senses he thought, 'How many of my father's hired workers have more than*



enough food to eat, but here am I, dying from hunger. I shall get up and go to my father and I shall say to him, 'Father, I have sinned against heaven and against you. I no longer deserve to be called your son; treat me as you would treat one of your hired workers.'" So he got up and went back to his father. While he was still a long way off, his father caught sight of him, and was filled with compassion. He ran to his son, embraced him and kissed him. His son said to him, *'Father, I have sinned against heaven and against you; I no longer deserve to be called your son.'* But his father ordered his servants, *'Quickly bring the finest robe and put it on him; put a ring on his finger and sandals on his feet. Take the fat-*

tened calf and slaughter it. Then let us celebrate with a feast, because this son of mine was dead, and has come to life again; he was lost, and has been found.' Then the celebration began. Now the older son had been out in the field and, on his way back, as he neared the house, he heard the sound of music and dancing. He called one of the servants and asked what this might mean. The servant said to him, *'Your brother has returned and your father has slaughtered the fattened calf because he has him back safe and sound.'* He became angry, and when he refused to enter the house, his father came out and pleaded with him. He said to his father in reply, *'Look, all these years I served you and not once did I disobey your orders; yet you never gave me even a young goat to feast on with my friends. But when your son returns who swallowed up your property with prostitutes, for him you slaughter the fattened calf.'* He said to him, *'My son, you are here with me always; everything I have is yours. But now we must celebrate and rejoice, because your brother was dead and has come to life again; he was lost and has been found.'"*

**New Liturgical Guidelines for the Catholic Diocese
of Richmond Parish Highlights**

Per the Governor of Virginia's Executive Order 79 (effective May 28, 2021), public health restrictions have ended in the Commonwealth, apart from continued guidance on mask wearing.

To clarify a few key points related to the celebration of Mass;

Fully vaccinated people no longer need to wear a mask in any setting

All unvaccinated parish members and visitors present for the liturgy ages 5 and older must cover their mouth and nose with a mask when present for any Mass or liturgical celebration.

Lord's Prayer and Sign of Peace- Parishes are to continue the practice of refraining from holding hands during the Lord's Prayer and shaking hands during the Sign of Peace (bow or verbal gesture is appropriate).

Distribution of the cup- The distribution of the cup remains suppressed for deacons and the lay faithful until further notice.

Gatherings- Effective May 28, 2021, there are no gathering limits before or after Mass. This means all social gatherings at the parish can resume (doughnuts, pot lucks, etc.)

A Brief History of St. Joseph

Giving thanks to the ten families, who, in the early 60's, came together to celebrate our Catholic heritage and to form our church here at St. Joseph's. Among them is current parishioner **Georgina Schaeffer**. Before our church was built in 1966, Georgina fondly remembers meeting as a Catholic community in various locations with a visiting priest. The communion services were held in Hillsville at Bob Carrington's service station, Dr. Walter "Barney" Jennings dental office, Vaughn Guynn McGrady funeral home and Roy Choate's store building across from our current church.

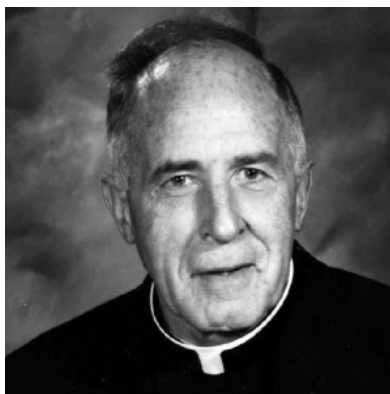
The land on which St. Joseph stands was purchased in January 1964 and our constructed church was dedicated on December 8, 1966 by Bishop Joseph Hodges of the Diocese of Wheeling, West Virginia when St. Joseph was a mission of St. Mary's in Wytheville. **Barbara Dwyer** recalls that when they moved here in 1967, Father Fahey was pastor. He lived in Wytheville and traveled the back mountain road to St. Joseph's and never

missed a single Sunday Mass.

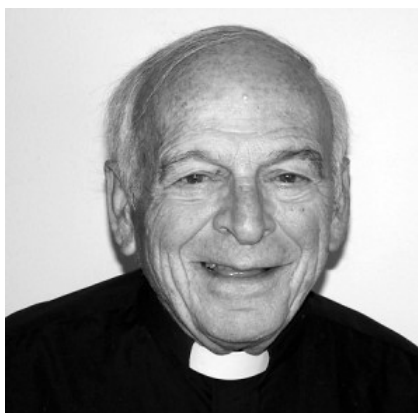

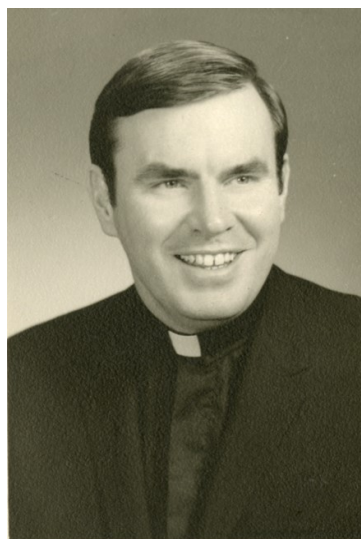

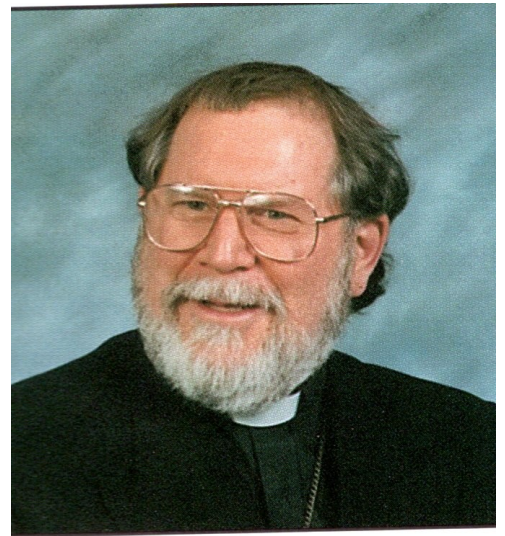

STATEMENT OF THE BISHOPS OF THE PROVINCE OF BALTIMORE AND THE ARCHDIOCESE OF WASHINGTON

Lifting the General Dispensation from the Obligation to Attend Mass

We, the Catholic Bishops of the Province of Baltimore and the Archdiocese of Washington, give thanks to Almighty God for the progress our country has made in curbing the coronavirus pandemic. The average number of new cases of COVID-19 continues to decline due to the observance of safety protocols and the increase of the availability of the vaccine. At this time, many places in our region are enjoying a return to some sense of normalcy.

Therefore, we are lifting the dispensation of the Sunday and Holy Days Mass obligation in the Archdiocese of Baltimore, the Archdiocese of Washington, and the Dioceses of Arlington, Richmond, Wheeling-Charleston, and Wilmington and reinstating that obligation beginning on Saturday, June 26, 2021 and Sunday, June 27, 2021. We welcome and encourage the Faithful to return to full in-person participation of the Sunday Eucharist, the source and summit of our Catholic faith (cf. Code of Canon Law, canon 1246-1247 and Catechism of the Catholic Church, n. 2180).

This obligation does not apply to those who are ill; those who have reason to believe that they were recently exposed to the coronavirus, another serious or contagious illness; those who are confined to their home, a hospital, or nursing facility; or those with serious underlying health conditions. One should consult his or her local pastor if questions arise about the obligation to attend Mass (Canon 1245 and the Catechism of the Catholic Church n. 2181).

Safety protocols and other liturgical directives in each diocese remain in effect until modified or revoked by the respective Diocesan Bishop.

Let us continue to be united in prayer for one another and for an end to the global pandemic.
