ANNUAL DIOCESAN APPEAL 2022.

“Master, we have worked hard all night and have caught nothing, but at your command I will lower the nets.” When they had done this, they caught a great number of fish and their nets were tearing.

Have you ever done a “trust fall”? It’s a pretty crazy concept. With your eyes closed and arms folded over your chest, you fall straight backwards. Of course, there’s a very important element that hasn’t yet been mentioned: someone is standing behind you, ready to catch you.

The “trust fall” illustrates such an important truth: we are only willing to take a risk, to “fall,” when someone we trust is with us.

In our Gospel today, Peter commits to his own “trust fall,” casting in his nets after a whole night of fruitless fishing, all because he trusts the Lord and the Lord instructs him to.

As a parish, we’re doing a “trust fall” right now, as we strive to respond to our Annual Diocesan Appeal. It can feel like a big risk to ask to be vulnerable and ask our community members to help meet our diocesan needs, but we do it because we trust—both in the Lord, but also in all the people who make up this parish community—including you.

Maybe contributing to the Annual Diocesan Appeal feels like a risk for you. Which is fine! The key, however, is to never forget that we’re not doing this alone. We’re taking part in the Annual Diocesan Appeal as part of a diocesan community we trust, and with the love and support of a Lord who never leaves us. When

we change our perspective from “fear” to “trust,” how does our willingness to give change? Take some time today to ground yourself in trust of the Lord, and see how your heart responds.

As St. Peter shows us, trusting in the Lord changes everything, and allows us to follow him more fully. With the Lord’s love and providence in mind, please consider contributing generously to our Annual Diocesan Appeal.

Jesus asks big things of us—because He knows that He’ll always be there for us. Our church needs your help in supporting our Annual Diocesan Appeal.

The Synod on Synodality



The Synod on Synodality is a two-year process of listening and dialogue to identify how we move together as one Church

Pope Francis invites the entire Church to reflect on a theme that is decisive for its life and mission: “It is precisely this path of synodality which God expects of the Church of the third millennium.” This journey, which follows in the wake of the Church’s “renewal” proposed by the Second Vatican Council, is both a gift and a task: by journeying together and reflecting together on the journey that has been made, the Church will be able to learn through Her experience which processes can help Her to live communion, to achieve participation, to open Herself to mission.

The individual parishes of the Diocese will be soliciting feedback from as many individual parishioners as possible during the month of February and will be submitting to the Bishop a summary of those discussions.

There are three main focal points for the Synod:

1) Journeying Together, Listening and Celebrating which can be summarized by identifying who is part of our Church and who isn’t? To whom should we listen and why? How can we improve giving a voice to minorities, the discarded

and excluded? How do we promote active participation in our faith and Liturgy?

2) Communication and Dialogue. This topic hopes to answer questions about how do we promote a free and authentic style of communication with the community? How are we able

to say what is important to us? Who speaks on our behalf? How do we address conflicts and divergences of vision? How do we or can we work with other Christian denominations within our community?

3) Called to Mission—this theme asks us to look at every baptized persons role in support of and participation in the varying works of the Church, political and scientific research, promoting social justice, human rights, caring for the Common home. How is authority exercised within our Church? How do we promote teamwork and co-responsibility? How can we improve the decision making process making it more transparent and accountable.

You may be asked to provide feedback directly to group topic leader selected from the parishioners of your parish. We encourage you to sit with them and give your thoughts on that topic/ theme. For individuals that prefer to express their opinions on all of the topics we will have participant guides available for you to complete in the timeframe necessary to have your opinions made known.
