

As we begin to feel the warmth of summer, we can reflect that we celebrate the feasts of **Trinity Sunday** (June 12), **Corpus Christ** (June 19), the **Sacred Heart of Jesus** (June 24) and the **Immaculate Heart of Mary** (June 25). God is Love and the Sacred Heart of Jesus — present on earth in the Blessed Sacrament — is the human manifestation of God's Love for men. Appropriately June is considered the month for weddings where human hearts join and cooperate with the Creator in bringing forth new life. The family they create is a human reflection of the Blessed Trinity. Also on June 6 we celebrate the **Memorial of Mary, Mother of the Church**. This feast is to be celebrated on the Monday following Pentecost.



The saints that we will focus on this month are **St. Justin** (June 1), **Sts. Marcellinus and Peter** (June 2), **St. Charles Lwanga & Companions** (June 3), **St. Norbert** (June 6), **St. Ephrem** (June 9), **St. Barnabas** (June 11), **St. Anthony of Padua** (June 13), **Sts. John Fisher and Thomas More** (June 22), **St. Cyril of Alexandria** (June 27), the **Solemnity of Sts. Peter and Paul** (June 29) and the **First Martyrs of the Church of Rome** (June 30).

The feasts of **St. Boniface** (June 5), **St. Romuald** (June 19) and **St. Josemaria Escriva** (June 26) are superseded by the Sunday liturgy. The Solemnity of the **Nativity of St. John the Baptist** (June 24) has been transferred this year to June 23 because of the Solemnity of the Sacred Heart. However, where Saint John the Baptist is the patron of a nation, diocese, city, or religious community, the Solemnity of the Nativity of Saint John the Baptist is instead celebrated on Friday, June 24, and the Solemnity of the Most Sacred Heart of Jesus is transferred to Thursday, June 23.

### Father Herman's Pastoral Message

Pentecost is the birthday of the Church, for it was the coming of the Holy Spirit upon the apostles that brought the Church into active life.

Jesus gave his apostles the Holy spirit and sent them on his mission.

The Holy Spirit leads us to turn away from sinfulness and reassures us that we are still loved in spite of our sin, and that Jesus died on a cross just to remedy the effects of those moments when we rebel against God.

It is the Holy Spirit Who urges us to take a good look at ourselves and where we are heading, to make a U-turn, to leave the old behind.

The Holy Spirit challenges us to do things for Christ – things we have never imagined ourselves doing. He says to us, "Stop being so self-focused. Stop looking into yourself all the time and being depressed by what you see about yourself.

Look up, look away, look to Jesus and let Him turn you around; let Him take control!"

The Holy Spirit is quietly at work everywhere in our lives. We find Him: in our taking on responsibilities that we once thought beyond us; in our refusing to let the greed of society take over our soul; in our giving thanks always, even though times have been hard; in our rising above past failures and putting past problems behind us.

Whenever we look to the Holy Spirit, He is with us as our Helper, always assisting us to be what God made us to be. The Holy Spirit helps us to be servants to one another. It is the Holy Spirit Who brings us around the cross of Jesus; Who helps us to be more patient and forgiving; Who enables us to seek new beginnings in our relationships with one another; Who urges us to let the power of God's love have the final say over the conflicts and difficulties we get into.

1) We need to permit the Holy Spirit to direct our lives: **a)** by appreciating His Presence within us, especially in the Sacraments of Baptism and Confirmation; **b)** by fortifying ourselves with the help of the Holy Spirit against all types of temptations; **c)** by seeking the assistance of the Holy Spirit in our thoughts, words, and deeds, and in the breaking of our evil habits, substituting them with acts of Goodness and Love; **d)** by listening to the voice of the Holy Spirit speaking to us through the Bible and through the good counsel of others;

2) We need to cultivate the spirit of forgiveness. The feast of Pentecost offers us the chance to look at the role which forgiveness should play in our dealings with others. We are challenged to examine our sense of compassion, patience and tolerance. Learning to forgive is a lifelong task, but the Holy Spirit is within us to make us agents of forgiveness. If we are prepared on this day of Pentecost

to receive the Holy Spirit into our lives, we can have confidence that our lives will be marked by the Spirit of forgiveness.

We need to be Spirit-filled Christians: Spirit-filled people acknowledge their weaknesses, ask for the strengthening, anointing and guidance of the Holy Spirit every morning, ask for His forgiveness every evening, and pass on that forgiveness to those who sin against them. Spirit-filled people are praying people. Spirit-filled people are praying and worshipping God in their families and parishes. They try to grow continually in their Faith, and they seek out every opportunity to discover Christ and what it means to be children of God.

Spirit-filled people are people who allow the Spirit to change their lives through their daily reading of the Bible and their frequenting of the Sacraments of Reconciliation and Holy Eucharist. Spirit-filled people speak words that heal, restore, make people happy and build people up, instead of tearing them down. Spirit-filled people pass on the love of God to the people living around them by their acts of kindness, mercy and charity. Hence, let us ask the Holy Spirit for a spirit of love, a spirit of generosity and a spirit of gentleness. Happy Pentecost Sunday.

### Mensaje Pastoral del Padre Herman

Pentecostés es el nacimiento de la Iglesia, porque fue la venida del Espíritu Santo sobre los apóstoles lo que llevó a la Iglesia a la vida activa.

Jesús dio a sus apóstoles el Espíritu Santo y los envió en su misión.

El Espíritu Santo nos lleva a alejarnos del pecado y nos asegura que todavía somos amados a pesar de nuestro pecado, y que Jesús murió en una cruz solo para remediar los efectos de esos momentos en que nos rebelamos contra Dios.

Es el Espíritu Santo quien nos insta a mirarnos bien a nosotros mismos y hacia dónde vamos, a dar la vuelta, a dejar atrás lo viejo.

El Espíritu Santo nos desafía a hacer cosas para Cristo, cosas que nunca nos imaginamos haciendo. Él nos dice: "Deja de ser tan egocéntrico. Deja de mirarte todo el tiempo y de deprimirte por lo que ves de ti mismo.

Mira hacia arriba, mira hacia otro lado, mira a Jesús y deja que Él te dé la vuelta; ¡que Él tome el control!"

El Espíritu Santo está obrando silenciosamente en todas partes de nuestras vidas. Lo encontramos: en nuestra asunción de responsabilidades que alguna vez pensamos que estaban más allá de nosotros; en nuestro rechazo a dejar que la codicia de la sociedad se apodere de nuestra alma; en nuestro dar gracias siempre, aunque los tiempos hayan sido difíciles; en nuestra superación de los fracasos del pasado y dejar atrás los problemas del pasado.

Cada vez que miramos al Espíritu Santo, Él está con nosotros como nuestro Ayudador, siempre ayudándonos a ser lo que Dios nos hizo para ser. El Espíritu Santo nos ayuda a ser siervos unos de otros. Es el Espíritu Santo Quien nos hace rodear la cruz de Jesús; Quien nos ayuda a ser más pacientes y perdonadores; Quien nos permite buscar nuevos comienzos en nuestras relaciones con los demás; Quien nos insta a dejar que el poder del amor de Dios tenga la última palabra sobre los conflictos y dificultades en que nos encontramos

1) Necesitamos permitir que el Espíritu Santo dirija nuestras vidas: a) apreciando Su Presencia dentro de nosotros, especialmente en los Sacramentos del Bautismo y la Confirmación; b) fortaleciéndonos con la ayuda del Espíritu Santo contra todo tipo de tentaciones; c) buscando la asistencia del Espíritu Santo en nuestros pensamientos, palabras y obras, y en la ruptura de nuestros malos hábitos, sustituyéndolos por actos de bondad y amor; d) escuchando la voz del Espíritu Santo que nos habla a través de la Biblia y del buen consejo de los demás;

2) Necesitamos cultivar el espíritu de perdón. La fiesta de Pentecostés nos ofrece la oportunidad de mirar el papel que debe jugar el perdón en nuestro trato con los demás. Tenemos el desafío de examinar nuestro sentido de la compasión, la paciencia y la tolerancia. Aprender a perdonar es una tarea de toda la vida, pero el Espíritu Santo está dentro de nosotros para hacernos agentes de perdón. Si estamos preparados en este día de Pentecostés para recibir el Espíritu Santo en nuestra vida, podemos tener la confianza de que nuestra vida estará marcada por el Espíritu del perdón.

Necesitamos ser cristianos llenos del Espíritu: Las personas llenas del Espíritu reconocen sus debilidades, piden el fortalecimiento, la unción y la guía del Espíritu Santo cada mañana, piden Su perdón cada noche y transmiten ese perdón a quienes pecan contra ellos. . Las personas llenas del Espíritu son personas que oran. Las personas llenas del Espíritu están orando y adorando a Dios en sus familias y parroquias. Tratan de crecer continuamente en su fe y buscan cada oportunidad para descubrir a Cristo y lo que significa ser hijos de Dios.

Las personas llenas del Espíritu son personas que permiten que el Espíritu cambie sus vidas a través de la lectura diaria de la Biblia y la frecuentación de los Sacramentos de la Reconciliación y la Sagrada Eucaristía. Las personas llenas del Espíritu hablan palabras que sanan, restauran, hacen felices a las personas y las edifican, en lugar de derribarlas. ## A Time of Love

Following Pentecost, the Church begins her slow descent from the great peaks of the Easter Season to the verdant pastures of Ordinary Time, the longest of the liturgical seasons. She pauses briefly, to praise the Holy Trinity — Creator, Redeemer, and Sanctifier; and then the Sacrament of the Body and Blood of Christ, *Corpus Christi*. Like the lush June growth all around us, the green of the liturgical season points to the new life won for us by the Redemption of Jesus Christ, the new life of Charity. For Our Lord came to cast the fire of His love on the earth, and to that end, sent His Holy Spirit at Pentecost in the form of tongues of fire.



Therefore, the close of the Easter season marks not the cessation but rather the beginning of Ordinary Time is the commencement of the Church's activity. Ordinary Time is the hour to "go out to all the world and tell the good news." The feasts of June highlight this expansion of the Church. At least ten times, the Church vests in the red of the martyrs whose blood is the very seed of her growth. She also celebrates the feasts of the Apostles Peter and Paul, and the birth of St. John the Baptist, proto-disciple and prophet.

We too are called to be witnesses like the apostles and martyrs. May the Heart of Jesus inflame our hearts so that we may be worthy of our Baptismal call to holiness. Immaculate Heart of Mary, pray for us.

The Month of June is dedicated to the Sacred Heart. The Church celebrates the Solemnity of the Sacred Heart of Jesus on the Friday following the second Sunday after Pentecost. In addition to the liturgical celebration, many devotional exercises are connected with the Sacred Heart of Jesus. Of all devotions, devotion to the Sacred Heart was, and remains, one of the most widespread and popular in the Church.

Understood in the light of the Scriptures, the term "Sacred Heart of Jesus" denotes the entire mystery of Christ, the totality of his being, and his person considered in its most intimate essential: Son of God, uncreated wisdom; infinite charity, principal of the salvation and sanctification of mankind. The "Sacred Heart" is Christ, the Word Incarnate,

Saviour, intrinsically containing, in the Spirit, an infinite divine-human love for the Father and for his brothers.
