

## **Month of the Precious Blood of Jesus**

The month of July is dedicated to the Precious Blood. The feast of the Precious Blood of our Lord was instituted in 1849 by Pius IX, but the devotion is as old as Christianity.

The early Fathers say that the Church was born from the pierced side of Christ, and that the sacraments were brought forth through His Blood.

"The Precious Blood which we worship is the Blood which the Savior shed for us on Calvary and re-assumed at His glorious Resurrection; it is the Blood which courses through the veins of His risen, glorified,



living body at the right hand of God the Father in heaven; it is the Blood made present on our altars by the words of Consecration; it is the Blood which merited sanctifying grace for us and through it washes and beautifies our soul and inaugurates the beginning of eternal life in it."

### PASTOR'S MESSAGE: PROPAGATE THE FAITH

The Church exists in order to evangelize. The moment it ceases to evangelize it will also cease to exist. The fundamental truth of our life in Christ is that God desires our full and willing cooperation to carry on the work of proclaiming the Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ to the ends of the earth. That is the mandate of the Lord in the Gospel texts we hear each time we attend the Mass and fundamental to our Christian faith and heritage.

The loving design of God always includes the participation of people themselves in bringing about God's work of salvation in Jesus Christ. In other words, we human beings form a body that receives redemption as a family and at the same time, we are the very people to propagate the Christian faith by sharing it with others.

Salvation in Jesus Christ is a gift of God to the entire human race, it's a gift that we must share with one another.

As Jesus went about from place to place, town to town, he likewise sent his disciples to announce that the kingdom of God is at hand. The Lord continues to call us in our respective vocations to do likewise.

It is our duty to spread the Gospel by promoting and helping the world-wide missionary activities of the Church with prayer, moral support, and financial aid.

Jesus wants all people to confess with their mouth that Jesus is Lord and believe in their hearts that God raised him from the dead so that they may be saved.

For one believes with the heart and so is justified, and one confesses with the mouth and so is saved.

For the scripture says, "No one who believes in him will be put to shame." For "everyone who calls on the name of the Lord will be saved."

But how can they call on him in whom they have not believed? And how can they believe in him of whom they have not heard? And how can they hear without someone to preach?

And how can people preach unless they are sent? As it is written, "How beautiful are the feet of those who bring the good news!"

Our apostolate is to be best expressed by our very conduct, that is, the way we behave and live out our commitment to Jesus Christ and his Gospel. Our message is to be: "The reign of God is at hand".

Witnessing and commitment are vital to every follower of Christ, and that simply means bringing Christ to those with whom we live and work, day in and day out, year after year.

So we do not necessarily need to go to the ends of the earth in order to be good and effective followers of Christ. Some followers of Jesus are in fact called to distant lands to preach, others are called to preach within their local communities.

It is important to remember that the presence of the disciples is not to be so spiritual as to neglect the daily needs of those who are ministered to but also to pay attention the corporal works of mercy, which include feeding the hungry, tending the sick, and clothing the naked, are vital aspect of the Christian apostolate.

Each of us should feel the urgency to act on the call from God to "go forth" as ambassadors of Jesus Christ. We are not only to announce but also to live the reality of the kingdom of God with all its demands and rewards, both in this life and in the next.

In a word, we best proclaim the Gospel by our lives, with simple and few words perhaps, but with an efficacy that flows from a direct, sincere, and humble response to Jesus' message here and now. The harvest is much but the laborers are few...

### MENSAJE DEL PASTOR: PROPAGAR LA FE

La Iglesia existe para evangelizar. En el momento en que deje de evangelizar también dejará de existir. La verdad fundamental de nuestra vida en Cristo es que Dios desea nuestra plena y voluntaria cooperación para llevar a cabo la obra de proclamar el Evangelio de nuestro Señor Jesucristo hasta los confines de la tierra.

Ese es el mandato del Señor en los textos del Evangelio que escuchamos cada vez que asistimos a la Misa y es fundamental para nuestra fe y herencia cristiana.

El diseño amoroso de Dios siempre incluye la participación de las personas mismas en la realización de la obra de salvación de Dios en Jesucristo. En otras palabras, los seres humanos formamos un cuerpo que recibe la redención como familia y, al mismo tiempo, somos las personas adecuadas para propagar la fe cristiana al compartirlo con los demás.

La salvación en Jesucristo es un don de Dios a todo el género humano, es un don que debemos compartir unos con otros.

Mientras Jesús iba de un lugar a otro, de un pueblo a otro, también envió a sus discípulos a anunciar que el reino de Dios está cerca. El Señor continúa llamándonos en nuestras respectivas vocaciones a hacer lo mismo.

Es nuestro deber difundir el Evangelio promoviendo y ayudando las actividades misioneras de la Iglesia en todo el mundo con oración, apoyo moral y ayuda financiera.

Jesús quiere que todas las personas confiesen con su boca que Jesús es el Señor y crean en sus corazones que Dios lo resucitó entre los muertos para que puedan ser salvos.

Porque uno cree con el corazón y así es justificado, y uno confiesa con la boca y así es salvo.

Porque la Escritura dice: "Nadie que crea en él será avergonzado". Porque "todo el que invoque el nombre del Señor será salvo".

Pero ¿cómo pueden invocar a aquel en quien no han creído? ¿Y cómo creerán en aquel de quien no han oído? ¿Y cómo pueden oír sin alguien que les predique?

¿Y cómo puede la gente predicar a menos que sea enviada? Como está escrito: "¡Qué hermosos son los pies de los que anuncian la buena noticia!"

Nuestro apostolado se expresa mejor en nuestra propia conducta, es decir, en la forma en que nos comportamos y vivimos nuestro compromiso con Jesucristo y su Evangelio. Nuestro mensaje debe ser: "El reino de Dios está cerca".

El testimonio y el compromiso son vitales para todo seguidor de Cristo, y eso simplemente significa llevar a Cristo a aquellos con quienes vivimos y trabajamos, día tras día, año tras año.

Así que no necesariamente necesitamos ir hasta los confines de la tierra para ser buenos y efectivos seguidores de Cristo. De hecho, algunos seguidores de Jesús son llamados a predicar a tierras lejanas, otros son llamados a predicar dentro de sus comunidades locales.

Es importante recordar que la presencia de los discípulos no debe ser tan espiritual como para descuidar las necesidades diarias de aquellos a quienes se ministra, sino también prestar atención a las obras de misericordia corporales, que incluyen alimentar al hambriento, atender a los enfermos, y vestir al desnudo, son aspectos vitales del apostolado cristiano.

Cada uno de nosotros debería sentir la urgencia de actuar de acuerdo con el llamado de Dios a "salir" como embajadores de Jesucristo. No solo debemos anunciar sino también vivir la realidad del reino de Dios con todas sus exigencias y recompensas, tanto en esta vida como en la venidera.

En una palabra, la mejor manera de proclamar el Evangelio es con nuestra vida, con palabras sencillas y pocas quizás, pero con una eficacia que brota de una respuesta directa, sincera y humilde al mensaje de Jesús aquí y ahora. La mierda es mucha pero los obreros pocos...

## **July is dedicate to the Precious Blood of Christ**

July is usually hot and a time for relaxing. It is also the time when crops planted in the Spring are maturing and growing. Just as the crops are dependent upon summer rains not only to grow but to survive so our spiritual development is dependent upon our frequenting the sacraments and receiving the Blood of Christ.



The main feasts of this month are **St. Junipero Serra** (July 1), **St. Anthony Mary and St. Elizabeth of Portugal** (July 5), **St. Maria Goretti**, (July 6), **St. Augustine Zhao Rong** (July 9), **St. Benedict** (July 11), **St. Henry** (July 13), **St. Kateri Tekakwitha** (USA - July 14), **St. Bonaventure** (July 15), **Our Lady of Mount Carmel** (July 16), **St. Camillus** (July 18), **St. Apollinaris** (July 20), **St. Lawrence of Brindisi** (July 21), **St. Mary Magdalene** (July 22), **St. Bridget** (July 23), **St. James** (July 25), **Sts. Joachim and Anne** (July 26), **St. Peter Chrysologus** (July 30).

The feasts of **St. Thomas the Apostle** (July 3), **St. Sharbel** (July 24) and **St. Ignatius of Loyola** (July 31) are superseded by the Sunday liturgy.

**Father Herman will begin his annual trip home to Uganda on July 24. He is scheduled to return to serve Mass on the weekend of August 27/28. There will be no daily Mass in his absence. We will also be unable to schedule sacramental preparations with a priest during this time.**

## **A Time of Regeneration**

The Blood that coursed through the veins of Christ was a part of that Sacred Humanity made possible by the maternity of Mary, whose parents, St. Joachim and St. Anne are honored this month. (July 26). Our Lord's blood poured out on the Cross purchased our salvation, washed clean the robes of the martyrs, and gave birth to the Church as it flowed from his wounded side. The Precious Blood of Christ — now pulsing through his Mystical Body — continues its salvific work, preserving and purifying, repairing and providing nourishment for regeneration and renewal of its members.



July's longer and warmer days also provide us with the opportunity for renewal, both interior and exterior. Schedules relax and pressures ease, inviting travel. But, whether we travel or not, like the missionary, St. Junipero Serra (July 1), we preach to others — by our conduct, our speech, even the clothes we wear. May we be modest in everything we do, imitating St. Maria Goretti, the young martyr for purity (July 6), and “preaching” Christ to everyone we meet.

The summer Readings of Ordinary Time remind us that our earthly pilgrimage is also a journey, a great adventure towards union with Christ, the Beginning and the End of our journey. Each Sunday with its Easter renewal becomes a mile marker along the way, linking where we have been with where we are going. May the Precious Blood of Jesus sustain us as we journey to our true home, with Mary and the angels as our companions on the way.


## TRI- AREA PREGNANCY BABY BOLLE CAMPAIGN
