



Since man is both a spiritual and physical being, the Church provides for the needs of man in his everyday life. The Church's liturgy and feasts in many areas reflect the four seasons of the year (spring, summer, fall and winter). The months of August, September, October and November are part of the harvest season, and as Christians we recall God's constant protection over his people and give thanksgiving for the year's harvest.

The September Ember Days were particularly focused on the end of the harvest season and thanksgiving to God for the season. Ember Days were three days (Wednesday, Friday and Saturday) set aside by the Church for prayer, fasting and

almsgiving at the beginning of each of the four seasons of the year. The ember days fell after December 13, the feast of St. Lucy (winter), after the First Sunday of Lent (spring), after Pentecost Sunday (summer), and after September 14, the feast of the Exaltation of the Holy Cross, after the Third Sunday of September (autumn). These weeks were known as the *quattuor tempora*, the *four seasons.* Since the late 5th century, the Ember Days were also the preferred dates for ordination of priests. So during these times the Church had a threefold focus: (1) sanctifying each new season by turning to God through prayer, fasting and almsgiving; (2) giving thanks to God for the various harvests of each season; and (3) praying for the newly ordained and for future vocations to the priesthood and religious life. Since the reorganization of the Roman calendar in 1969 after the Second Vatican Council, Ember Days are still retained in principle, but how and when they are to be observed is at the discretion of each country's Episcopal Conference. There is no longer set Mass readings for the Ember Days in the current Roman Missal.

Another harvest feast is September 29, the Feast of the Archangels Michael, Gabriel and Raphael. Before the revision of the calendar, this used to be only the feast of St. Michael. In many countries this day was referred to as "Michaelmas" and celebrated with traditional foods and customs.

Pastor's Message.

Thank you for your prayers and facilitation, I had a wonderful vacation where I was able to visit my family especially my Dad, siblings and friends.

This was a special vacation for it was free from any Covid-19 re-



strictions.

While visiting my home village, I was able to distribute school sup-

plies to 340 students of my village you do-nated to them.

It was joy everywhere and their parents were very grateful. Teachers write notes on class-room boards and stu-dents transfer these notes to their books.

Students use hard cover books that are sometimes super ex-pensive for average parents. Text books are too expensive for them as upcountry students. The books they received, were a great relief to the par-ents especially at this



time when students are about to return to school for their end of year term.

I attended an ordination ceremony at the Cathedral of the Diocese where 21 deacons became priests and 13 seminarians became deacons. The ceremony started at 9:30am and ended at 3:00pm.

The congregation which included Christians from the Diocese of



Richmond patiently and actively followed the ceremony up to the end. On the following weekend, 80 miles from my diocese

at the archdiocese of Kampala, the Archbishop ordained 19 priests and 7 deacons.

The big number of new priests has prompted Bishops to create new parishes in order to bring services closer to the people. Christians need parishes within walkable distances since they don't have proper means of transport.

Schools are also located within walkable distances although some stu-



dents have to walk for more than an hour to reach school. Our village is located far away from High schools, that's why sometime back, I decided to buy a couple of bicycles to facilitate students' transportation to school.

In Uganda Parishes are subdivided into small units called sub-parishes or mission parishes, each sub-parish has its own church headed by a catechist who sometimes conducts a service when the priests are unable to come. The people simply walk to their parish church and priests drive from the parish to celebrate mass for the people in their sub-parishes.

Our sub-parish church serves 5 villages and is located in the center of these villages.

Most households on my village of approximately 2000 people are Catholics. Often times the priest celebrates mass on my village in the open ground under the tent.

The size of the population indicates that in the near future this village will also be raised to the level of a Sub-parish where we shall have our own small village church.

There is still hope for the church's growth in Uganda. The education of the young population is very important and priests and catechists can always meet the children for Religious Education at school.

I returned safely to the US and I thank you for your prayers and for all the assistance you gave me. May the Good Lord bless you all.

Mensaje del Pastor.

Gracias por sus oraciones y facilitación, tuve unas vacaciones maravillosas donde pude visitar a mi familia, especialmente a mi papá, hermanos y amigos. Estas fueron unas vacaciones especiales porque no tenían restricciones de Covid-19.



Mientras visitaba mi pueblo natal, pude distribuir útiles escolares a 340 estudiantes de mi pueblo que usted les donó.

Había alegría en todas partes y sus padres estaban muy agradecidos. Los maestros escriben notas en las pizarras del salón de clases y los estudiantes transfieren estas notas a sus libros.

Los estudiantes usan libros de tapa dura que a veces son muy caros para los padres promedio. Los libros de texto son demasiado caros para ellos como estudiantes del interior del país. Los libros que recibieron fueron un gran alivio para los padres, especialmente en este momento en que los estudiantes están a punto de regresar a la escuela para su período de fin de año.

Asistí a una ceremonia de ordenación en la Catedral de la Diócesis donde 21 diáconos se convirtieron en sacerdotes y 13 seminaristas se convirtieron en diáconos. La ceremonia comenzó a las 9:30 am y finalizó a las 3:00 pm.

La congregación, que incluía a cristianos de la Diócesis de Richmond, siguió paciente y activamente la ceremonia hasta el final. El fin de semana siguiente, a 80 millas de mi diócesis en la archidiócesis de Kampala, el arzobispo ordenó a 19 sacerdotes y 7 diáconos.

El gran número de nuevos sacerdotes ha llevado a los obispos a crear nuevas parroquias para acercar los servicios a la gente. Los cristianos necesitan parroquias a distancias caminables ya que no tienen medios de transporte adecuados.

Nuestra iglesia sub-parroquial sirve a 5 pueblos y está ubicada en el centro de estos pueblos.

La mayoría de los hogares en mi pueblo de aproximadamente 2000 personas son católicos. Muchas veces el sacerdote celebra misa en mi pueblo en el campo abierto debajo de la carpita.

El tamaño de la población indica que en un futuro próximo este pueblo también se elevará al nivel de sub-parroquia donde tendremos nuestra propia pequeña iglesia de pueblo.

Todavía hay esperanza para el crecimiento de la iglesia en Uganda. La educación de la población joven es muy importante y los sacerdotes y catequistas siempre pueden encontrar a los niños para la Educación Religiosa en la escuela.

Regresé sano y salvo a los EE. UU. y les agradezco sus oraciones y toda la ayuda que me brindaron. Que el Buen Dios los bendiga a todos.


TRI- AREA PREGNANCY BABY BOTTLE CAMPAIGN
