Alleluia Alleluia. Has Risen As He Said, Alleluia. Our Lord always told his disciples that he would die and rise. They were astonished to hear that he would die at all: they could not see it as a possible scenario that he could die by the terrible death. However it was through suffering, and resurrection that he would accomplish his Heavenly Father's Mission. His mission was to liberate the human race from the original sin that had been inherited from our first parents, Adam and Eve who gave in to the temptation of the evil one and disobeyed their creator. As the Psalmist says: The LORD is compassionate and gracious, slow to anger and abounding in love, when Adam and Eve sinned God immediately promised in Genesis 3:15 that the offspring of the woman would strike the head of the serpent. Jesus Christ was that offspring of the woman that was promised in Genesis 3:15 to come forth and destroy Satan and reconcile the human race with God. Throughout his public ministry Jesus encountered tremendous opposition from different classes of people of his time. Jesus spent three years preaching to people the message of divine love, redemption and salvation. His message was opposed majorly by the Pharisees, Scribes, Religious leaders, Sadducees and elders. He tried to correct their mistakes but their prejudice and pride would not allow them to accept Jesus as the Messiah sent by God to save his people from their sins. He performed several miracles of healing and restoration of life however they rejected all these signs and some said He performs miracles by the power of Beelzebub, the prince of demons. In their opinion a Messiah had to perform signs from their own list of signs. They continued to demand for signs from him to prove his messiahship. Fed up by their unbelief, Jesus said, "A wicked and adulterous generation demands a sign, but none will be given it except the sign of the prophet Jonah. For as Jonah was three days and three nights in the belly of the great fish, so the Son of Man will be three days and three nights in the heart of the earth. He was implying his death. The Pharisees and scribes made plans to eliminate him and persuaded all other people to support his death. It was his suffering, death and resurrection that saved the human race from their sins. He accepted to die so that mankind might be set free. He rose from the dead for our sake, and there would be no need for us to remain in the tomb of sadness, hopelessness, and despair when he has overcome the powers of death and the grave. Let us become transparent Christians, radiating the Risen Lord around us in the form of selfless and sacrificial love, mercy, compassion, and the spirit of humble service. Each time we try to practice Christian charity, mercy, and forgiveness, and each time we fight against temptations, we share in the Resurrection of Jesus. Happy Easter to you all! Alleluia Alleluia

Aleluya Aleluya. Ha Resucitado Como Dijo, Aleluya. Nuestro Señor siempre les dijo a sus discípulos que moriría y resucitaría. Se asombraron al escuchar que moriría en absoluto: no podían verlo como un escenario posible de que pudiera morir por la terrible muerte. Sin embargo, fue a través del sufrimiento y la resurrección que él cumpliría la Misión de su Padre Celestial. Su misión fue liberar al género humano del pecado original que había sido heredado de nuestros primeros padres, Adán y Eva, quienes cedieron a la tentación del maligno y desobedecieron a su creador. Como dice el salmista: El Señor es compasivo y clemente, tardo para la ira y grande en amor, cuando Adán y Eva pecaron, Dios inmediatamente prometió en Génesis 3:15 que la descendencia de la mujer heriría la cabeza de la serpiente. Jesucristo fue la descendencia de la mujer a la que se le prometió en Génesis 3:15 que vendría y destruiría a Satanás y reconciliaría a la raza humana con Dios. A lo largo de su ministerio público, Jesús encontró una tremenda oposición de diferentes clases de personas de su tiempo. Jesús pasó tres años predicando a la gente el mensaje del amor divino, la redención y la salvación. Los fariseos, escribas, líderes religiosos, saduceos y ancianos se opusieron mayoritariamente a su mensaje. Trató de corregir sus errores pero sus prejuicios y orgullo no les permitieron aceptar a Jesús como el Mesías enviado por Dios para salvar a su pueblo de sus pecados. Realizó varios milagros de sanidad y restauración de vida sin embargo rechazaron todas estas señales y algunos dijeron que Él realiza milagros por el poder de Beelzebub, el príncipe de los demonios. En su opinión, un Mesías tenía que realizar señales de su propia lista de señales. Continuaron exigiéndole señales para probar su mesianismo. Harto de su incredulidad, Jesús dijo: "Una generación mala y adúltera demanda una señal, pero no se le dará sino la señal del profeta Jonás. Porque como estuvo Jonás en el vientre del gran pez tres días y tres noches, así estará el Hijo del Hombre en el corazón de la tierra tres días y tres noches. Estaba insinuando su muerte. Los fariseos y los escribas hicieron planes para eliminarlo y persuadieron a todas las demás personas para que apoyaran su muerte. Fue su sufrimiento, muerte y resurrección lo que salvó a la raza humana de sus pecados. Aceptó morir para que la humanidad pudiera ser liberada. Él resucitó de entre los muertos por nuestro bien, y no habría necesidad de que permanezcamos en la tumba de tristeza, desesperanza y desesperación cuando haya vencido los poderes de la muerte y la tumba. Hagámonos cristianos transparentes, irradiando al Señor Resucitado a nuestro alrededor en forma de amor desinteresado y sacrificio, misericordia, compasión y espíritu de servicio humilde. Cada vez que tratamos de practicar la caridad cristiana, la misericordia y el perdón, y cada vez que luchamos contra las tentaciones, compartimos la Resurrección de Jesús. ¡Feliz Pascua a todos! Ugandan High School Students Assisted by Risen Lord and St. Joseph Communities

The recent generosity of a Risen Lord parishioner enabled the purchase of eleven bicycles and 5 soccer balls for use by the student of St. Maurice High School in Uganda.



Fr. Herman explained that students attending this school, include some from his home village, fall into two categories, borders and day scholars.

The day scholars travel back and forth to school every day and the trip can easily take one hour each way. The bicycles donated by the parishioner at Risen Lord were given to the day scholar to ease their commuting time.

An additional \$561.00 collected last summer to support Uganda schoolchildren by St. Joseph Hispanic community members will be used to purchase additional bicycles.



Father Herman reports that the bicycles cost around \$100 in Uganda and are shared by children and adults alike to ease transport. When asked about the soccer balls, Fr. Herman smiled and said "The balls are like life for the children. Everyone loves football (soccer) so much in Uganda"
