During September, as in all of Tempus per Annum, or Ordinary Time (formerly known as Time After Pentecost), the Liturgy does not focus on one particular mystery of Christ, but views the mystery of Christ in all its aspects. We follow the life of Christ through the Gospels, and focus on the teachings and parables of Jesus and what it means for us to be a follower of Christ. During Ordinary Time we can concentrate more on the saints and imitate their holiness as Christ's followers.

This month the main liturgical feasts are:

Nativity of Mary (September 8),
St. Peter Claver (September 9),
Holy Name of Mary (September 12),
St. John Chrysostom (September 13),
Exaltation of the Holy Cross (September 14),
Our Lady of Sorrows (September 15),
Sts. Cornelius and Cyprian (September 16),
St. Januarius (September 19),
St. Andrew Kim and Companions (September 20),
St. Matthew (September 21),
St. Pio (September 23),
Sts. Cosmas and Damian (September 26),
St. Vincent de Paul (September 27),
Sts. Michael, Gabriel and Raphael (September 29) and
St. Jerome (September 30).

The commemorations of St. Gregory the Great (September 3) and St. Robert Bellarmine and and Hildegard of Bingen (September 17) fall on a Sunday so they are superseded by the Sunday Liturgy.

FATHER HERMAN'S SEPTEMBER MESSAGE;

EXALTATION OF THE CROSS AND OUR LADY OF SEVEN SORROWS:

On September 14th and 15th, the feasts of Exaltation of the Cross and the Memorial of Our Lady of Seven Sorrows respectively are celebrated. It was on the wood of the cross on which hung the life of the world. The cross, an instrument of torture continues to confound human wisdom. God's work of salvation supersedes human understanding.

The Cross is the Tree of Life that offers eternal life to all who believe in Jesus Christ. We remember that the Tree of Life has its roots in the history of God's chosen people, brought out of slavery from Egypt. They complained against God and poisonous serpents were sent to bite them. Through God's mercy, Moses raised up a Bronze Serpent, so that those who had been bitten by serpents might be healed and live after looking at it. The Lord is a God of mercy, of healing, of forgiveness and of life.

Through Jesus' death on the Cross, we are glorified. Just as Moses raised up his staff to heal the Israelites, Jesus was raised up on the Tree of Life so that everyone who believes in him may have eternal life. It is on that Tree of Life that true life is offered to us. It is on that Tree of Life that the ultimate sacrifice was made for us, through Jesus' unconditional love for us.

On the exaltation of the Holy Cross, we remember that Jesus suffered on the Tree of Life for our sake. The Tree of Life continues to give life when we allow ourselves to be raised up on it, when we give our lives for the sake of others. The Christian life demands us to love God with all our being, and to love our neighbors as ourselves. By stretching ourselves to offer God's mercy to our neighbors, we allow the Tree of Life to bloom.

During this same month we celebrate the feast of Our Lady of Seven Sorrows, we stand with Mary at the foot of the Cross. While majority of Jesus' disciples fled, following His arrest, The Blessed Virgin Mary remained standing by the foot of the cross.

We share in her sorrow as the sword pierced her heart in seeing her Son suffer and die on the Cross.

That sword of sorrow had been foretold long ago by Simeon when Mary and Joseph brought Jesus for presentation in the Temple.

Even though Mary knew that she was to suffer, she stood by Jesus

all the way to the Cross. It was a difficult moment for the Blessed virgin Mary to watch her innocent son suffering from the hands of cruel people.

And this is exactly the experience of many mothers today. There are quite many mothers the world over who are grieving due the loss of their dear children.

The sight of the Mother and Child meeting was a picture of total sadness. Tears filled both their eyes, the Divine Child and the Sorrowful Mother! One with a Cross over the shoulders the other a cross in the heart!

Both however, sang the same chorus - "Fiat voluntas tua", Thy Will be done Lord! Life often puts us to situations of total hopelessness and darkness when the way ahead seems closed! The Compassionate Mother Mary becomes a model for us: To remain faithful and loyal amidst trials of life.

Mary will also stand by us in our moments of sorrow, because on the Cross, Jesus gave her to us to be our mother.

Sorrow can come into our life. But Just as Mary's seven sorrows turned to joy at the Resurrection, let us hold on to our faith in God's promises.

Our sorrows will also turn to joy as we see the roses and rainbows of God's promises being fulfilled.

During this month, let us pray for those who continue to endure similar sufferings that they may receive from God the strength they need to continue to carry their spiritual crosses.

MENSAJE DE SEPTIEMBRE DEL PADRE HERMAN;

EXALTACIÓN DE LA CRUZ Y NUESTRA SEÑORA DE LOS SIETE DOLORES:

Los días 14 y 15 de septiembre se celebran las fiestas de Exaltación de la Cruz y Memorial de Nuestra Señora de los Siete Dolores respectivamente. Fue en el madero de la cruz de la que pendía la vida del mundo. La cruz, instrumento de tortura, sigue confundiendo la sabiduría humana. La obra de salvación de Dios reemplaza el entendimiento humano.

La Cruz es el Árbol de la Vida que ofrece vida eterna a todo aquel que cree en Jesucristo. Recordamos que el Árbol de la Vida tiene sus raíces en la historia del pueblo elegido de Dios,

sacado de la esclavitud de Egipto. Se quejaron contra Dios y fueron enviadas serpientes venenosas para morderlos. Por la misericordia de Dios, Moisés levantó una Serpiente de Bronce, para que aquellos que habían sido mordidos por serpientes pudieran sanarse y vivir después de mirarla. Es en ese Árbol de la Vida donde se nos ofrece la verdadera vida. Es en ese Árbol de la Vida donde se hizo el máximo sacrificio por nosotros, a través del amor incondicional de Jesús por nosotros.

En la exaltación de la Santa Cruz, recordamos que Jesús sufrió en el Árbol de la Vida por nosotros. El Árbol de la Vida sigue dando vida cuando nos dejamos levantar en él, cuando damos la vida por el bien de los demás. La vida cristiana exige que amemos a Dios con todo nuestro ser y amemos a nuestro prójimo como a nosotros mismos. Al esforzarnos para ofrecer la misericordia de Dios a nuestro prójimo, permitimos que florezca el Árbol de la Vida.

Durante este mismo mes celebramos la fiesta de Nuestra Señora de los Siete Dolores, estamos con María al pie de la Cruz. Mientras la mayoría de los discípulos de Jesús huyeron, tras su arresto, la Santísima Virgen María permaneció de pie al pie de la cruz.

Compartimos su dolor cuando la espada atravesó su corazón al ver a su Hijo sufrir y morir en la Cruz.

Esa espada de dolor había sido predicha mucho tiempo atrás por Simeón cuando María y José llevaron a Jesús para presentarlo en el Templo.

Aunque María sabía que iba a sufrir, estuvo junto a Jesús durante todo el camino hasta la Cruz. Fue un momento difícil para la Santísima Virgen María ver a su hijo inocente sufrir a manos de personas crueles.

Y ésta es exactamente la experiencia de muchas madres hoy en día. Hay muchas madres en todo el mundo que están de luto por la pérdida de sus queridos hijos.

La visión del encuentro entre Madre e Hijo era un cuadro de total tristeza. ¡Las lágrimas llenaron sus ojos, el Divino Niño y la Madre Dolorosa! ¡Uno con una Cruz sobre los hombros y el otro con una cruz en el corazón!

Ambos, sin embargo, cantaron el mismo estribillo: "Fiat voluntas tua", ¡Hágase Tu Voluntad Señor! ¡La vida nos pone a menudo en situaciones de total desesperanza y oscuridad cuando el camino por delante parece cerrado! La Compasiva Madre María se convierte en un modelo para nosotros: permanecer fieles y leales en medio de las pruebas de la vida.

María también estará a nuestro lado en nuestros momentos de dolor, porque en la Cruz Jesús nos la entregó por madre nuestra.

El dolor puede llegar a nuestra vida. Pero así como los siete dolores de María se convirtieron en alegría en la Resurrección, aferrémonos a nuestra fe en las promesas de Dios.



Month of the Harvest



Since man is both a spiritual and physical being, the Church provides for the needs of man in his everyday life. The Church's liturgy and feasts in many areas reflect the four seasons of the year (spring, summer, fall and winter). The months of August, September, October and November are part of the harvest season, and as Christians we recall God's constant protection over his

people and give thanksgiving for the year's harvest.

The September Ember Days were particularly focused on the end of the harvest season and thanksgiving to God for the season. Ember Days were three days (Wednesday, Friday and Saturday) set aside by the Church for prayer, fasting and almsgiving at the beginning of each of the four seasons of the year. The ember days fell after December 13, the feast of St. Lucy (winter), after the First Sunday of Lent (spring), after Pentecost Sunday (summer), and after September 14, the feast of the Exaltation of the Holy Cross, after the Third Sunday of September (autumn). These weeks were known as the quattor tempora, the "four seasons."

Since the late 5th century, the Ember Days were also the preferred dates for ordination of priests. So during these times the Church had a threefold focus: (1) sanctifying each new season by turning to God through prayer, fasting and almsgiving; (2) giving thanks to God for the various harvests of each season; and (3) praying for the newly ordained and for future vocations to the priesthood and religious life.

Since the reorganization of the Roman calendar in 1969 after the Second Vatican Council, Ember Days are still retained in principle, but how and when they are to be observed is at the discretion of each country's Episcopal Conference. There is no longer set Mass readings for the Ember Days in the current Roman Missal.

Another harvest feast is September 29, the Feast of the Archangels Michael, Gabriel and Raphael. Before the revision of the calendar, this used to be only the feast of St. Michael. In many countries this day was referred to as "Michaelmas" and celebrated with traditional foods and customs.

St. Michael's Waffles



This is an American version of St. Michael's Gaufres, or waffles. In France, paper-thin sweet wafers called gaufres were baked by street vendors who set up their stands near

the great cathedral

to lure worshipers coming from Mass on St. Michael's Day to taste their wares. Not many people have a gaufrier, the special waffle iron used in France, but if you wish to serve waffles for supper on St. Michael's Day, you'll be right with tradition.

The Feast of St. Michael on September 29 has become a combined feast for the archangels Michael, Raphael and Gabriel. This feast is also called Michaelmas.

DIRECTIONS

Blend eggs and sugar. Add flour and milk alternately. Beat hard. Add butter and vanilla. The mixture is thin and should spread evenly on the preheated iron. If Gaufres tend to stick, butter both sides of the iron. Serve hot or cold.
