October, as in all of Tempus per Annum, or Ordinary Time (formerly known as Time After Pentecost), the Liturgy does not focus on one particular mystery of Christ, but views the mystery of Christ in all its aspects. We follow the life of Christ through the Gospels, and focus on the teachings and parables of Jesus and what it means for each of us to be a follower of

Christ.

<p>The month of October is dedicated to Our Lady of Rosary or Our Lady of Victory. By the intercession of the Blessed Virgin Mary, the Church has won many battles over a time in many places the world allover. Chief among these, is the Battle of Lepanto October 7, 1571. Christians prayed the Rosary asking for the intercession of the Virgin Mary and victory was granted to them. In honor of Our Lady, Pope Pius V instituted the Feast of Our Lady of Victory, which is still celebrated today as the Feast of Our Lady of the Rosary on October 7.</p>	<p>It was also the intercession of Mary that strengthened the faith of the early Christians and enabled them to preach the Good news of her Son, Jesus Christ, amidst persecutions and intimidation. It is always our prayer that her maternal intercession today guides the Church as she did for the early Christians so that our evangelization efforts may yield a splendid flowering of Christian life. In all our evangelization efforts, we join the Blessed Virgin Mary as we do the work of her Son Jesus Christ.</p>	<p>El mes de octubre está dedicado a Nuestra Señora del Rosario o Nuestra Señora de la Victoria. ### The Mysteries of the Rosary


Until about the 15th century hundreds of mysteries were part of the Rosary devotion then the 15 mysteries that we know today were definitively fixed as "the Mysteries of the Rosary." Pope John Paul II, in his encyclical, Rosarium Virginis Mariae, in 2002 added the five Luminous Mysteries.

Through the meditations of the complete Rosary one recalls and has impressed on his mind, the Popes tell us, "the chief mysteries of the Christian religion," "the mysteries of our Redemption," "the great mysteries of Jesus and His Mother united in joys, sorrows, and triumphs." The twenty mysteries are divided into four equal groups, known as "The Joyful," "The Sorrowful," "The Glorious," and "The Luminous Mysteries."



## ALL SAINTS YARD SALE


