PASTOR'S MESSAGE ON CORPUS CHRISTI SUNDAY.

This month, we celebrate the feast of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Jesus Christ, known as Corpus Christi.


The last two precious gifts given to us by Jesus are the Holy Eucharist as our spiritual food on Holy Thursday and Jesus' mother Mary as our spiritual mother on Good Friday. Corpus Christi is the celebration of the presence of a loving God as Emmanuel – God with us. On this feast we give special thanks to God for his living with us in the Eucharist.

This feast also gives us an occasion to learn more about the importance and value of the "Real Presence" so that we may appreciate the Sacrament better and receive maximum benefit from it whenever we receive it.

We believe in the "Real Presence" of Jesus in the Holy Eucharist because Jesus instituted the Holy Eucharist during his Last Supper meal and commanded his disciples to repeat it in his memory.

On this feast, we are called above all to have faith in the fact, that the Eucharist or the Holy Communion we partake of, is in fact, a reception of the very Body, Blood, Soul and Divinity of Jesus Christ, in his glorified state. We do not partake of a symbol. The Eucharist is not a metaphor, it is truly Jesus Christ. Neither is it a "piece" of his flesh, but is Christ in full. Jesus said, "I am the living bread that came down from Heaven, whoever eats this bread will live forever".

The reception of the body and blood of our Lord is not an option but is a requirement. Jesus himself says, "Unless you eat the flesh of the Son of Man and drink his blood, you have no life in you". The Bible also says that whoever eats my flesh and drinks my blood has eternal life and I will raise him on the last day.



So whenever we come for the Eucharistic celebration we need to share at the meal Jesus prepares for us. If we don't eat the Body and blood of our Lord we begin to grow weak and later on experience a spiritual death. Given the fact that we are not eating the normal bread but Christ Himself, worthy reception of our Lord is very important. We need to prepare ourselves for the worth reception of Jesus.

To prepare ourselves to receive Holy Communion worthily, "St. Paul urges us to examine our conscience: 'Whoever, therefore, eats the bread or drinks the cup of the Lord unworthily will be guilty of profaning the body and blood of the Lord. Let a man examine himself, and so eat of the bread and drink of the cup.'

Anyone conscious of a grave sin must receive the sacrament of Reconciliation before coming to communion. The church encourages all its members to prepare themselves before they come to receive the body of Christ. We need to be free from sin and also fast from food and drink at least an hour prior to receiving Holy Communion as our health and age may permit as well as other factors. Proper and modest dressing is also an important factor as we come to receive Holy Communion. If for some reasons one is keeping something in the mouth, it is good to take it out before receiving Holy Communion.

In order to show much more respect to the blessed Sacrament it is good that we genuflect towards the blessed Sacrament each time we enter the Church. It is not good at all to walk up to our seats before we genuflect. Our genuflection is a statement. It shows that we believe in the real presence of Jesus Christ in the species of bread and wine. If we cannot genuflect we can do a deep bow towards the Tabernacle as a way of showing unreserved reverence to the blessed sacrament.

It is common on this feast to carry the Blessed Sacrament in a splendid procession through the town or on the parish property after the Mass on Corpus Christi Day. It is a public profession of the Catholic faith in

the real presence of Christ in the Holy Sacrament. Happy Corpus Christi Sunday.

MENSAJE DEL PASTOR DEL DOMINGO DE CORPUS CHRISTI.

Este mes celebramos la fiesta del Santísimo Cuerpo y Sangre de Jesucristo, conocida como Corpus Christi.

Los dos últimos preciosos regalos que Jesús nos dio son la Sagrada Eucaristía como nuestro alimento espiritual el Jueves Santo y la madre de Jesús, María, como nuestra madre espiritual el Viernes Santo. Corpus Christi es la celebración de la presencia de un Dios amoroso como Emmanuel – Dios con a nosotros. En esta fiesta damos gracias especiales a Dios por vivir con nosotros en la Eucaristía. Esta fiesta también nos brinda la oportunidad de aprender más sobre la importancia y el valor de la “Presencia Real” para que podamos apreciar mejor el Sacramento y recibir el máximo beneficio cada vez que lo recibamos.

Creemos en la “Presencia Real” de Jesús en la Sagrada Eucaristía porque Jesús instituyó la Sagrada Eucaristía durante su Última Cena y ordenó a sus discípulos que la repitieran en su memoria.

En esta fiesta, estamos llamados sobre todo a tener fe en el hecho de que la Eucaristía o Sagrada Comunión que participamos es, de hecho, una recepción del mismo Cuerpo, Sangre, Alma y Divinidad de Jesucristo, en su glorificación. estado. No participamos de un símbolo. La Eucaristía no es una metáfora, es verdaderamente Jesucristo. Tampoco es un “trozo” de su carne, sino que es Cristo en plenitud. Jesús dijo: “Yo soy el pan vivo que descendió del cielo, el que come este pan vivirá para siempre”.

La recepción del cuerpo y sangre de nuestro Señor no es una opción sino un requisito. El mismo Jesús dice: “Si no coméis la carne del Hijo del Hombre y no bebéis su sangre, no tenéis vida en vosotros”. La Biblia también dice que el que come mi carne y bebe mi sangre tiene vida eterna y yo lo resucitaré en el último día.

Entonces, cada vez que venimos a la celebración eucarística debemos compartir la comida que Jesús prepara para nosotros. Si no comemos el Cuerpo y la sangre de nuestro Señor comenzamos a debilitarnos y luego experimentamos una muerte espiritual. Dado que no estamos comiendo el pan normal sino a Cristo mismo, la recepción digna de nuestro Señor es muy importante. Necesitamos prepararnos para la digna recepción de Jesús.

Para prepararnos para recibir dignamente la Sagrada Comunión, “St. Pablo nos insta a examinar nuestra conciencia: “Cualquiera, pues, que coma el pan o beba la copa del Señor indignamente, será culpable de profanar el cuerpo y la sangre del Señor. Examíñese cada uno a sí mismo, y coma así del pan y beba de la copa.

Cualquier persona consciente de un pecado grave debe recibir el sacramento de la Reconciliación antes de comulgarse. La iglesia anima a todos sus miembros a prepararse antes de venir a recibir el cuerpo de Cristo. Necesitamos estar libres de pecado y también ayunar de comida y bebida al menos una hora antes de recibir la Sagrada Comunión, según lo permita nuestra salud y edad, así como otros factores. Vestirse apropiada y modestamente también es un factor importante cuando venimos a reci-

bir la Sagrada Comunión. Si por alguna razón uno se queda con algo en la boca, es bueno sacarlo antes de recibir la Sagrada Comunión.

Para mostrar mucho más respeto al Santísimo Sacramento es bueno que hagamos una genuflexión hacia el Santísimo Sacramento cada vez que entramos a la Iglesia. No es nada bueno acercarnos a nuestros asientos antes de hacer una genuflexión. Nuestra genuflexión es una declaración. Muestra que creemos en la presencia real de Jesucristo en las especies de pan y vino. Si no podemos hacer una genuflexión, podemos hacer una profunda reverencia hacia el Tabernáculo como una forma de mostrar reverencia sin reservas al santísimo sacramento.

Es común en esta fiesta llevar el Santísimo Sacramento en una espléndida procesión por el pueblo o en la propiedad parroquial después de la Misa del Día del Corpus Christi. Es una profesión pública de la fe católica en la presencia real de Cristo Sacramentado. Feliz domingo de Corpus Christi.

A Time of Love

Following Pentecost, the Church begins her slow descent from the great peaks of the Easter Season to the verdant pastures of Ordinary Time, the longest of the liturgical seasons. She pauses briefly, to praise the Holy Trinity — Creator, Redeemer, and Sanctifier; and then the Sacrament of the Body and Blood of



Christ, Corpus Christi. Like the lush June growth all around us, the green of the liturgical season points to the new life won for us by the Redemption of Jesus Christ, the new life of Charity. For Our Lord came to cast the fire of His love on the earth, and to that end, sent His Holy Spirit at Pentecost in the form of tongues of fire.

Therefore, the close of the Easter season marks not the cessation but rather the beginning of Ordinary Time is the commencement of the Church's activity. Ordinary Time is the hour to "go out to all the world and tell the good news." The feasts of June highlight this expansion of the Church. At least ten times, the Church vests in the red of the martyrs whose blood is the very seed of her growth. She also celebrates the feasts of the Apostles Peter and Paul, and the birth of St. John the Baptist, protodisciple and prophet.

We, too, are called to be witnesses like the apostles and martyrs. May the Heart of Jesus inflame our hearts so that we may be worthy of our Baptismal call to holiness. Immaculate Heart of Mary, pray for us.

This plastic recycling program keeps thousands of bottles out of landfills each year.






