Father Herman's July Message

This weekend we rejoice in the spirit of prophecy and faithful witness to Christ. Although the exercise of this mission does not bring us comfort, we must continue to exercise it. This is because the grace of God is sufficient for us and makes us strong.

As children of God, we encounter resistance and discouragements every day.

However like Ezekiel, we all have a prophetic call and mission from God. The question is, where is this mission, and how do we begin it? Quite simple! There is a mission everywhere today. There is a prophetic mission in our rebellious generation, families, communities, and our streets, workplaces, schools, and the world at large.

There is much rebellion in our time against God, against nature, against divine the church, and the fabrics of our moral, social and cultural heritage. So, God speaks to us today as he said to Ezekiel. "Son of man, I am sending you... to the rebels who have turned against me." So, we must be that voice that cries against injustice, oppression, immorality, corruption, and ungodliness.

In the second reading, Paul describes his burden for the sake of the gospel. This burden was like a thorn in his flesh. For Paul, the burden includes: "insults, hardships, persecutions, loneliness, and agonies." They were his cross as a prophet. Unfortunately, these are things we do not want to experience. This is because we do not like discomfort. So, we want everyone to like us and to say only good things about us.

So, even when things go wrong under our watch and nose, we are afraid to speak out. You do not want to hurt anybody. You do not want to lose him or her. Unfortunately, the truth is that if you do not correct or help him or her today, tomorrow you will lose him or her forever.

God saw this same fear in Jeremiah and said to him: "Get ready, Jeremiah; go and tell them everything I command you to say. Do not be afraid of them or I will make you even more afraid of them". The truth is that these are burdens, we must bear as Christians if our society must be safe. We must not be afraid because the grace of God is sufficient for us. So, if we are willing, God will fill us with his grace.

In the gospel, Jesus was filled with this grace and spoke fearlessly. Of course, he got his share of insults. They ridiculed him, called him names like: "The son of a mere carpenter." They called him an illiterate and a rebel. Despite all these, he was not discouraged. Instead, he continued to preach and heal his generation.

We must not be afraid to carry out our prophetic ministries despite the odds against us. Instead, we are to bear them patiently so that, good might triumph over evil, truth over a lie, light over darkness and, peace over war. "Where there is no prophetic vision the people perish". We are all called to be that visionary prophet to our ailing generation.

Mensaje de julio del padre Herman

Este fin de semana nos regocijamos en el espíritu de profecía y testimonio fiel de Cristo. Aunque el ejercicio de esta misión no nos trae consuelo, debemos seguir ejercitándola. Esto se debe a que la gracia de Dios es suficiente para nosotros y nos hace fuertes.

Como hijos de Dios, cada día encontramos resistencias y desafíos.

Sin embargo, al igual que Ezequiel, todos tenemos un llamado y una misión profética de Dios. La pregunta es, ¿dónde está esta misión y cómo la iniciamos? ¡Bastante sencillo! Hoy hay una misión en todas partes. Hay una misión profética en nuestra generación rebelde, en nuestras familias, comunidades y en nuestras calles, lugares de trabajo, escuelas y en el mundo en general.

Hay mucha rebelión en nuestro tiempo contra Dios, contra la naturaleza, contra la iglesia divina y los tejidos de nuestra herencia moral, social y cultural. Entonces, Dios nos habla hoy como le dijo a Ezequiel. "Hijo de hombre, te envío... a los rebeldes que se han vuelto contra mí". Por eso, debemos ser esa voz que clama contra la injusticia, la opresión, la inmoralidad, la corrupción y la impiedad.

En la segunda lectura, Pablo describe su carga por el bien del evangelio. Esta carga era como un aguijón en su carne. Para Pablo, la carga incluye: "insultos, penurias, persecuciones, soledad y agonías". Eran su cruz como profeta. Desafortunadamente, estas son cosas que no queremos experimentar. Esto se debe a que no nos gusta la incomodidad. Por eso queremos agradar a todo el mundo y que sólo digan cosas buenas sobre nosotros.

Por eso, incluso cuando las cosas van mal ante nuestras narices, tenemos miedo de hablar. No quieres lastimar a nadie. No quieres perderlo. Lamentablemente, la verdad es que si no lo corriges o lo ayudas hoy, mañana lo perderás para siempre. Dios vio este mismo temor en Jeremías y le dijo: "Prepárate, Jeremías; ve y diles todo lo que te mando que digas. No les tengas miedo o haré que les tengas aún más miedo". La verdad es que estas son cargas que debemos llevar como cristianos si nuestra sociedad debe estar segura. No debemos tener miedo porque la gracia de Dios nos basta. Entonces, si estamos dispuestos, Dios nos llenará de su gracia.

En el evangelio, Jesús se llenó de esta gracia y habló sin miedo. Por supuesto, recibió su parte de insultos. Lo ridiculizaron, lo llamaron con nombres como: "El hijo de un simple carpintero". Lo llamaron analfabeto y rebelde. A pesar de todo esto, no se desanimó. En cambio, continuó predicando y sanando a su generación.

No debemos tener miedo de llevar a cabo nuestros ministerios proféticos a pesar de las probabilidades en nuestra contra. En cambio, debemos soportarlos con paciencia para que el bien triunfe sobre el mal, la verdad sobre la mentira, la luz sobre las tinieblas y la paz sobre la guerra. "Donde no hay visión profética el pueblo perece". Todos estamos llamados a ser ese profeta visionario para nuestra generación enferma.

Each Sunday with its Easter renewal becomes a mile marker along the way, linking where we have been with where we are going. May the Precious Blood of Jesus sustain us as we journey to our true home, with Mary and the angels as our companions on the way.


Over-the-counter bottles: DO NOT REMOVE LABELS. No sticky bottles, please

Permanently honor deceased family members (even if they were not parishioners here) with a memorial brick. Proceeds from the sale of Memorial Bricks will be used to beautify the church exterior (statuary, plantings informational signs etc.)




