Fr. Herman's August Message.

Last Sunday, Jesus fed five thousand people and the following day, a great crowd came looking for him and wanted him to repeat the same miracle of the multiplication of loaves.

They didn't come because they had seen the signs but because they had had all the bread they wanted.

Jesus did not perform the miracle again because they were looking for him only for physical food, instead, he wanted to let them know about a 'spiritual food'.

Our Lord goes further to instruct them not to work for the food that perishes but for the food that endures for eternal life, that he gives. The food that gives eternal life is, to believe Jesus as a Messiah sent by God.

As the conversation continued, the people asked for a sign to enable them to believe him. They pretended to have forgotten the miracle of the loaves and fish.

He told them to work for the food that will endure forever.

At the multiplication of loaves, the people ate and had enough for that day, but the next day, they were hungry.

Jesus told them: "I am the true bread of life; whoever comes to me will never hunger, and whoever believes in me will never thirst."

The multiplication of the five loaves and two fish was a pointer to the fact that Jesus Christ, the true bread, who is broken and shared to feed us, can also satisfy everybody, so everyone is welcome to share.

At the multiplication of loaves Jesus wanted to teach his followers about the bread of heaven but he first attracted them with ordinary bread.

Similarly, in our faith encounter with God, sometimes, God attracts us with perishable goods and other earthly benefits and blessings. His intention is not just to give us material satisfaction but he wants to use them as means of drawing us closer to Himself.

It is unfair on our side, as human beings to receive so much from God and in the end, neglect the provider.

It happens so often that when people are doing fine, they turn

their backs towards God.

As material beings, we are more interested in material things and these are the things that can easily catch our attention.

Most of us are spiritually hungry, we lack the spiritual strength to move on with our faith-journey, therefore we must look for spiritual food that endures.

We are hungry for the Word of God which is life, we must look for every avenue of being fed with it. We must pray for the grace to live a holy life and for an increase in faith.

It is not enough to pray for only physical needs and neglect the spiritual needs, a mistake that was made by the people who met Jesus demanding only physical food and neglecting their spiritual needs.

We should not restrict our search for God to our bodily needs but to the wellbeing of our souls.

An important lesson for us today is that when we pay too much attention to material things, we forfeit the spiritual meaning of life.

So, our relationship with God and others must not be based solely on how much material things we can get from them.

Christ is the bread of life. He is present in the Holy Eucharist. Each time we celebrate Him, we celebrate and receive life.

He strengthened the Israelites in the desert when: "He gave them bread from heaven." Hence, to support us for our spiritual journey on earth, Christ offers us himself at every Mass.

We are indeed blessed as we pray at every Mass: "Blessed are those called to the Lord's supper."

P. Mensaje de agosto de Herman.

El domingo pasado Jesús alimentó a cinco mil personas y al día siguiente, una gran multitud vino a buscarlo y quería que repitiera el mismo milagro de la multiplicación de los panes.

No vinieron porque habían visto las señales sino porque habían tenido todo el pan que querían.

Jesús no volvió a realizar el milagro porque lo buscaban sólo para alimento físico, sino que quería informarles sobre un "alimento espiritual".

Nuestro Señor va más allá al instruirles a no trabajar por el alimento que perece sino por el alimento que perdura para vida eterna, que él

da. El alimento que da vida eterna es creer en Jesús como el Mesías enviado por Dios.

Mientras continuaba la conversación, la gente pidió una señal para poder creerle. Fingieron haber olvidado el milagro de los panes y los peces.

Les dijo que trabajaran por la comida que duraría para siempre.

En la multiplicación de los panes, el pueblo comió y tuvo suficiente para ese día, pero al día siguiente tenían hambre.

Jesús les dijo: “Yo soy el verdadero pan de vida; el que a mí viene, nunca tendrá hambre, y el que cree en mí, nunca tendrá sed”.

La multiplicación de los cinco panes y los dos peces fue un indicador del hecho de que Jesucristo, el verdadero pan, que se parte y se comparte para alimentarnos, también puede satisfacer a todos, por lo que todos son bienvenidos a compartir.

En la multiplicación de los panes Jesús quiso enseñar a sus seguidores sobre el pan del cielo pero primero los atrajo con pan común y corriente.

De manera similar, en nuestro encuentro de fe con Dios, a veces, Dios nos atrae con bienes perecederos y otros beneficios y bendiciones terrenales. Su intención no es sólo darnos satisfacción material, sino que quiere utilizarla como medio para acercarnos más a Él.

Es injusto de nuestra parte, como seres humanos, recibir tanto de Dios y al final descuidar al proveedor.

Sucede muy a menudo que cuando a las personas les va bien, le dan la espalda a Dios.

Como seres materiales, estamos más interesados en las cosas materiales y estas son las cosas que pueden captar nuestra atención fácilmente.

La mayoría de nosotros tenemos hambre espiritual, nos falta la fuerza espiritual para seguir adelante con nuestro viaje de fe, por lo tanto debemos buscar alimento espiritual que perdure.

Tenemos hambre de la Palabra de Dios que es vida, debemos buscar todas las vías para alimentarnos de ella. Debemos orar por la gracia de vivir una vida santa y por un aumento en la fe.

No es suficiente orar sólo por las necesidades físicas y descuidar las necesidades espirituales, un error que cometieron las personas que conocieron a Jesús exigiendo sólo alimento físico y descuidando sus necesidades espirituales.

No debemos restringir nuestra búsqueda de Dios a nuestras necesidades corporales sino al bienestar de nuestra alma.

Una lección importante para nosotros hoy es que cuando prestamos demasiada atención a las cosas materiales, perdemos el significado espiritual de la vida.

Por lo tanto, nuestra relación con Dios y con los demás no debe basarse únicamente en la cantidad de cosas materiales que podemos obtener de ellos.

Cristo es el pan de vida. Está presente en la Sagrada Eucaristía. Cada vez que lo celebramos, celebramos y recibimos vida.

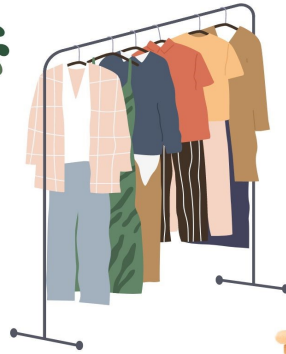

August 15 the Church celebrates the **Solemnity of the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary**, a Holy Day of Obligation. On November 1, 1950, Pius XII defined the dogma of the Assumption. Thus he solemnly proclaimed that the belief whereby the Blessed Virgin Mary, at the close of her earthly life, was taken up, body and soul, into the glory of heaven, definitively forms part of the deposit of faith, received from the Apostles. To avoid all that is uncertain the Pope did not state either the manner or the circumstances of time and place in which the Assumption took place—only the fact of the Assumption of Mary, body and soul, into the glory of heaven, is the matter of the definition.

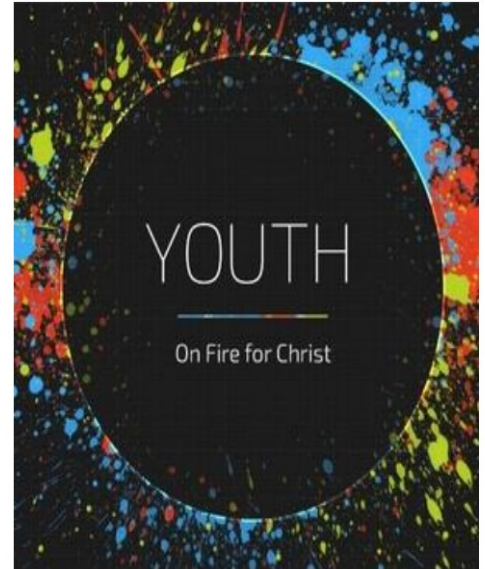
