FATHER HERMAN'S OCTOBER MESSAGE

The month of October is considered the Month of the Rosary in the Catholic church. This is because the Feast of Our Lady of the Rosary is celebrated on October 7th. The feast was established by Pope Pius V in 1571 to commemorate the victory of the Christian forces in the Battle of Lepanto.

The Pope was afraid that one day the forces of the Ottoman empire would march freely on the streets of the Eternal City. He organized other European states and formed a Holy League to thwart the advancement of Ottoman empires forces towards the Mediterranean region. This victory was crucial as it marked the first major defeat of the Ottoman navy and halted their expansion westwards.

The Battle of Lepanto was a last Naval engagement when a coalition of Catholic states arranged by Pope Pius V inflicted a major defeat on the fleet of the Ottoman Empire. Though heavily outnumbered, the Christian forces won over the Muslim forces, preventing them from overrunning Western Europe.

Pope Pius V attributed this victory to the intercession of the Blessed Virgin Mary, believing that the widespread praying of the Rosary by Christians played a key role in the outcome. This belief led to the establishment of the Feast of Our Lady of the Rosary.

Throughout October, Catholics are encouraged to pray the Rosary more frequently and reflect on its mysteries, which focus on significant events in the lives of Jesus Christ and the Virgin Mary. The Rosary is a powerful form of prayer and meditation, and dedicating a month to it, helps to deepen the faith and devotion of the faithful.

The victory was generally attributed to the heavenly intervention and intercession of the Blessed Mother.

The Rosary can solve so many of our problems; no matter how difficult it is, whether temporal or spiritual, or in the personal life of each one of us, or in our families, or in the families of the

world, or of the religious communities, or even of the life of peoples and nations."

The holy rosary is so powerful and effective because first it is a simple and humble prayer. Those who pray it are formed spiritually in littleness, in meekness and in simplicity of heart. This is precisely the weapon against the pride and arrogance of the devil. People who pray the Rosary should always remain humble just like the blessed Virgin Mary.

MENSAJE DE OCTUBRE DEL PADRE HERMAN

El mes de octubre es considerado el Mes del Rosario en la iglesia católica. Esto se debe a que el 7 de octubre se celebra la Fiesta de Nuestra Señora del Rosario. La fiesta fue establecida por el Papa Pío V en 1571 para conmemorar la victoria de las fuerzas cristianas en la Batalla de Lepanto.

El Papa temía que algún día las fuerzas del imperio otomano marcharan libremente por las calles de la Ciudad Eterna. Organizó otros estados europeos y formó una Liga Santa para frustrar el avance de las fuerzas del imperio otomano hacia la región mediterránea. Esta victoria fue crucial ya que marcó la primera gran derrota de la armada otomana y detuvo su expansión hacia el oeste.

La Batalla de Lepanto fue el último enfrentamiento naval cuando una coalición de estados católicos organizada por el Papa Pío V infligió una gran derrota a la flota del Imperio Otomano. Aunque muy superadas en número, las fuerzas cristianas se ganaron a las fuerzas musulmanas, impidiéndoles invadir Europa occidental.

A lo largo de octubre, se anima a los católicos a rezar el Rosario con más frecuencia y reflexionar sobre sus misterios, que se centran en acontecimientos importantes en las vidas de Jesucristo y la Virgen María. El Rosario es una poderosa forma de oración y meditación, y dedicarle un mes ayuda a profundizar la fe y la devoción de los fieles.

La victoria fue generalmente atribuida a la intervención e intercesión celestial de la Santísima Madre.

El Rosario puede resolver muchos de nuestros problemas; por difícil que sea, ya sea temporal o espiritual, o en la vida personal de cada uno de

nosotros, o en nuestras familias, o en las familias del mundo, o de las comunidades religiosas, o incluso de la vida de los pueblos y naciones.

El santo rosario es tan poderoso y eficaz porque primero es una oración sencilla y humilde. Quienes lo rezan se forman espiritualmente en la pequeñez, en la mansedumbre y en la sencillez de corazón. Ésta es precisamente el arma contra el orgullo y la arrogancia del diablo. Las personas que rezan el Rosario deben permanecer siempre humildes como la Santísima Virgen María.

El Papa Pío V atribuyó esta victoria a la intercesión de la Santísima Virgen María, creyendo que el rezo generalizado del Rosario por parte de los cristianos jugó un papel clave en el resultado. Esta creencia llevó al establecimiento de la Fiesta de Nuestra Señora del Rosario.

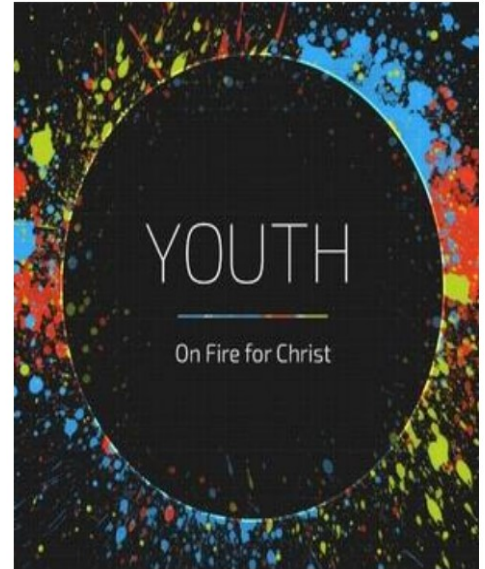
