Pope Francis stated in his February 2022 letter announcing the Jubilee 2025: "We must fan the flame of hope that has been given us and help everyone to gain new strength and certainty by looking to the future with an open spirit, a trusting heart and far-sighted vision. The forthcoming Jubilee can contribute greatly to restoring a climate of hope and trust as a prelude to the renewal and rebirth that we so urgently desire..."

The Jubilee Year will offer the faithful opportunities to participate in various jubilee events at the Vatican and in their own dioceses. The great tradition of opening the Holy Door will begin when Pope Francis opens the Holy Door of St. Peter's Basilica on December 24, 2024. Other holy doors will be opened at the Rome basilicas of St. John Lateran, St. Mary Major and St. Paul Outside the Walls. For pilgrims who cannot travel to Rome, bishops around the world are expected to designate their cathedrals or a popular Catholic shrine as special places of prayer for Holy Year pilgrims, offering opportunities for reconciliation, indulgences and other events intended to strengthen and revive faith.

How to Use an AED

Per the American Red Cross, the following AED steps should be used when caring for a nonbreathing child aged 8 or older, who weighs more than 55 pounds, or an



adult. • After checking the scene and ensuring that the person needs help, you should ask a bystander to call 911 for help. • As soon as an AED is available, turn it on and follow the voice prompts. • Remove the victim's shirt and attach pads as directed. o Remove all clothing covering the chest. If necessary, wipe the chest dry o Shave any excessive chest hair and remove any jewelry. o Place one pad on the upper right side of the chest. Place the other pad on the lower left side of the chest, a few inches below the left armpit. • Plug the pad connector cable into the AED, if necessary. • Prepare to let the AED analyze the victim's heart rhythm. o Make sure no one is touching the victim. o Say, "CLEAR!" in a loud, commanding voice. • Deliver a shock, if the AED determines one is needed. • After the AED delivers the shock, or if no shock is advised, immediately start CPR, beginning with chest compressions. Leave the pad connectors in place as an additional shock may be needed. • CPR should continue till EMS arrives. • Ensure that the person in charge of the AED is aware that the AED was used so that supplies can be replaced.

Over-the-counter bottles: DO NOT REMOVE LABELS.
No sticky bottles, please

Bring your bottles to any Parish and they will be delivered to Risen Lord.

If you are a Parishioner St. Joseph Parish or knew someone who was, consider honoring them with a memorial brick installed in the St. Joseph Memorial Garden. Families, Individuals, anyone who made a Sacrament (First Eucharist, Confirmation, Marriage) are encourage to honor them with a memorial brick. 


