Imitation of the Holy Family

The Holy Family models for us what family life should exemplify. It is a school of virtue for both parents and children. There we find God, and learn how to connect with God and with others.

The family is where love is freely given without self-interest. It is where we learn to love, to pray and to practice the gift of charity. Pope John Paul II has said, “The family, more than any other human reality, is the place in which the person is loved for himself and in which he learns to live the sincere gift of self” (Nov. 27, 2002).

We should ask ourselves if our own families model that of the Holy Family. We need to be open to God’s grace to value the positive and to accept our mistakes — and to be willing to rectify them. Parenting is a very challenging responsibility and at times errors are made despite the best intentions. Recognizing this, children should trust their parents and never forget that parents want only what is best for them.

Which leads us to what may be the most important family virtue — forgiveness. Living so intimately within the family nucleus naturally gives rise to unpleasant situations where someone is apt to be offended. St. Paul knew this when he told us to



“bear with and forgive one another.” The health of our family may depend on how quickly we learn to forgive without harboring feelings of resentment.

No family can thrive and grow without constant work.

Even the material details that take time and effort are essential to keeping the family strong. Everyone has to pull together for the good of the family — even to the point of putting ahead of our own needs and ambitions the happiness of other family members, setting aside our own selfish desires.

It is also important to pray as a family, especially the holy rosary. Prayer will help us to intensify our closeness with each other and to learn to forgive.

During this Year of the Eucharist it is essential to discover the relationship between the Eucharist and family life. Pope John Paul II wrote, “In the eucharistic gift of charity the Christian family finds the foundation and soul of its communion and its mission” (*Letter on the Family*, No. 91). — Excerpted from *The Holy Family models what family life should be*, Archbishop Charles J. Chaput, O.F.M. Cap.

Imitación de la Sagrada Familia

La Sagrada Familia nos modela lo que la vida familiar debería ejemplificar. Es una escuela de virtud tanto para padres como para hijos. Allí encontramos a Dios y aprendemos a conectarnos con Dios y con los demás. La familia es donde el amor se da gratuitamente y sin interés propio.

Es donde aprendemos a amar, a orar y a practicar el don de la caridad. El Papa Juan Pablo II ha dicho: "La familia, más que cualquier otra realidad humana, es el lugar en el que la persona es amada por sí misma y en el que aprende a vivir el don sincero de sí" (27 de noviembre de 2002).

Deberíamos preguntarnos si nuestras propias familias modelan la de la Sagrada Familia. Necesitamos estar abiertos a la gracia de Dios para valorar lo positivo y aceptar nuestros errores, y estar dispuestos a rectificarlos. La crianza de los hijos es una responsabilidad muy desafiante y, a veces, se cometan errores a pesar de las mejores intenciones. Al reconocer esto, los niños deben confiar en sus padres y nunca olvidar que los padres sólo quieren lo mejor para ellos.

Lo que nos lleva a la que puede ser la virtud familiar más importante: el perdón. Vivir tan íntimamente dentro del núcleo familiar naturalmente da lugar a situaciones desagradables en las que alguien puede sentirse ofendido. San Pablo lo sabía cuando nos dijo que "soportáramos y perdonáramos unos a otros". La salud de nuestra familia puede depender de qué tan rápido aprendamos a perdonar sin albergar sentimientos de resentimiento.

Ninguna familia puede prosperar y crecer sin un trabajo constante. Incluso los detalles materiales que requieren tiempo y esfuerzo son esenciales para mantener fuerte a la familia. Todos tenemos que trabajar juntos por el bien de la familia, incluso hasta el punto de anteponer a nuestras propias necesidades y ambiciones la felicidad de otros miembros de la familia, dejando de lado nuestros propios deseos egoístas.

También es importante rezar en familia, especialmente el santo rosario. La oración nos ayudará a intensificar nuestra cercanía unos con otros y a aprender a perdonar.

Durante este Año de la Eucaristía es fundamental descubrir la relación entre la Eucaristía y la vida familiar. El Papa Juan Pablo II escribió: "En el don eucarístico de la caridad la familia cristiana encuentra el fundamento y el alma de su comunión y de su misión" (Carta sobre la Familia, n. 57). — Extraído de La Sagrada Familia modela lo que debería ser la vida familiar, Arzobispo Charles J. 
Breakfast will be served after Mass on February 16. All are welcome to attend this fun fellowship event.



From Feast to Fast

Though the shortest month of the year, February is rich in Liturgical activity. It contains a feast (Presentation of our Lord) that bridges two other seasons (Christmas and Easter). The Feast of the [Presentation of the Lord](#) on February 2nd harkens back to the Christmas mystery of Light except that now, Christ, the helpless babe, is "the Light of Revelation to the Gentiles who will save his people from their sins." Candles, symbolizing Christ our Light, will be carried in procession this day, as will be the Paschal candle during the Easter Vigil Liturgy. In addition, the faithful may receive in February two of the four major public sacramentals that the Church confers during the liturgical year: blessed candles and the blessing of throats "The Light of Revelation" shines more brightly with each successive Sunday of Ordinary Time, until its magnificence—exposing our sinfulness and need for conversion—propels us into the penitential Season of Lent. We prepare to accept the cross of blessed ashes on Ash Wednesday (March 5) and plunge ourselves into anticipating the major exercises of Lent—fasting, prayer, almsgiving—laying our thoughts and prayers on the heart of our Mother Mary. She, who offered her Son in the temple and on the Cross, will teach us how to deny ourselves, take up our cross daily, and follow after her Son.

If you are a Parishioner St. Joseph Parish or knew someone who was, consider honoring them with a memorial brick installed in the St. Joseph Memorial Garden. Families, Individuals, anyone who made a Sacrament (First Eucharist, Confirmation, Marriage) are encouraged to honor them with a memorial brick. Permanently honor deceased family members (even if they were not parishioners here) with a memorial brick. Proceeds from the sale of Memorial Bricks will be used to beautify the church exterior (statuary, plantings informational signs etc.)


